- It offered a comprehensive overview of core concepts and practical techniques for effective application.



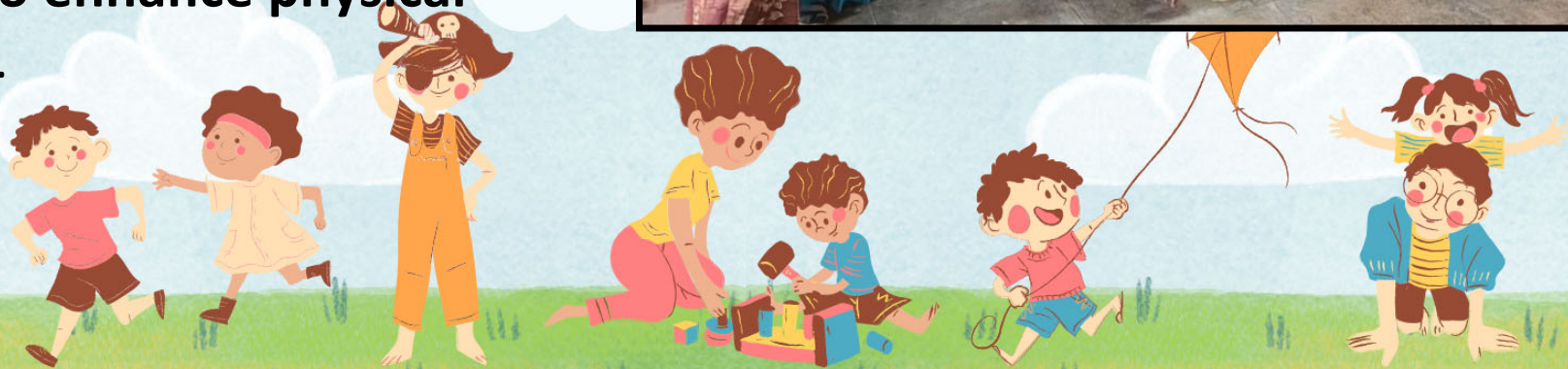


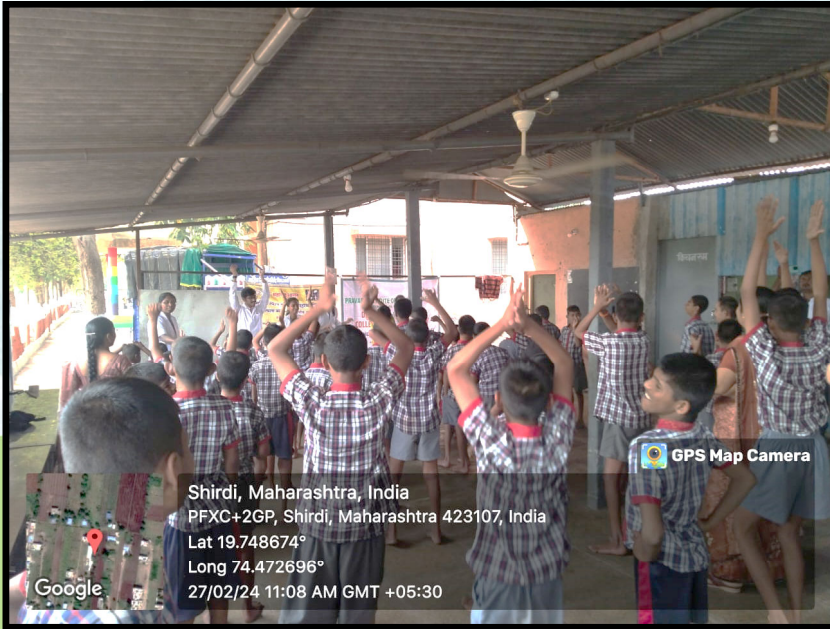

WORLD DOWN SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH

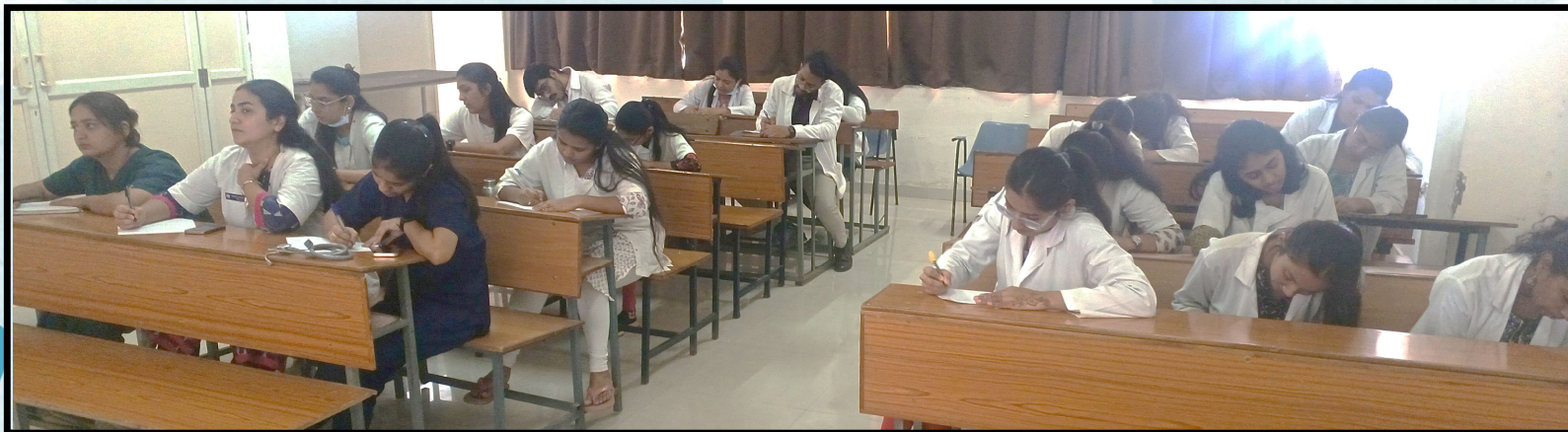
March 2024

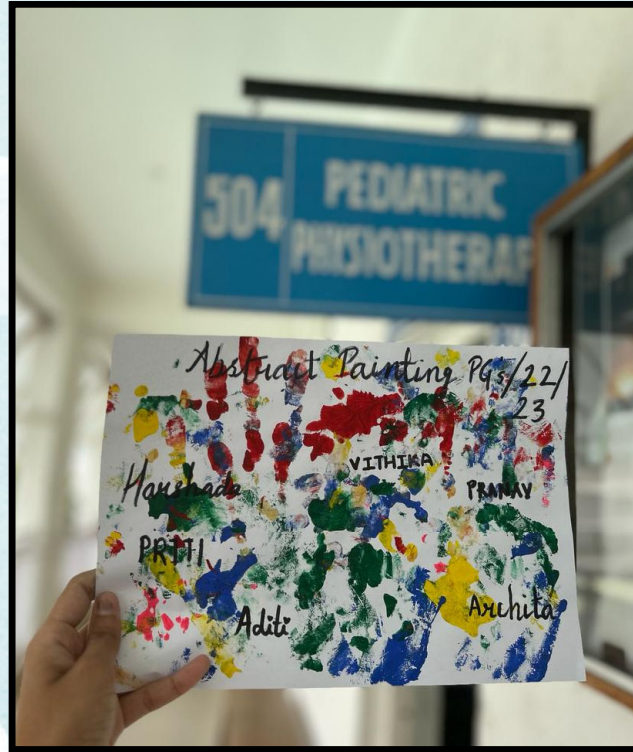




ART THERAPY SESSION FOR AUTISM PATIENTS
