MESSAGE

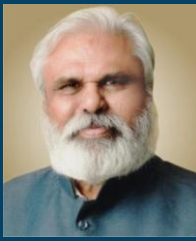

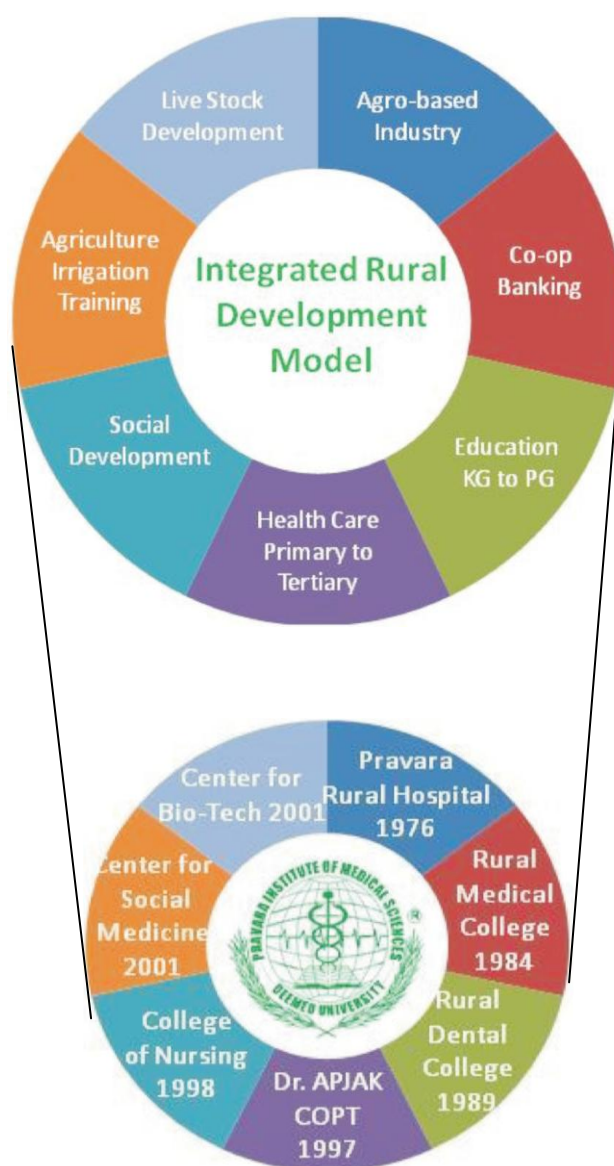

Consideration of the Idea of a University

Preface & Introduction

Pravara Medical Trust was established in 1972 by the rare visionary, most revered and respected, Padmashri Awardee, Dr. Vitthalrao Vikhe Patil, founder of first co-operative sugar factory in Asia, in 1948, at Loni – a remote village of Maharashtra, a feat appreciated by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the then Prime Minister of India. He also initiated and led Pravara cooperative movement for inclusive-holistic rural development, education and health care. The functional and realistic model of integrated, participative, sustainable rural development as well as comprehensive holistic health care and education, successfully launched by the rare visionary and ambassador of socioeconomic change, is popularly known as “Pravara –Loni model of PURA”, commended by Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, the then President of India.

The Background:

Dr. Vitthalrao Vikhe Patil, a farmer of Loni, a draught prone backward village of Maharashtra, realized the importance of integrated rural development to solve the problems of illiteracy, poverty, hunger, unemployment, social inequality, economic exploitation, poor public and personal health, shelter, clothing and basic amenities in rural areas, which were the real challenges before a young independent India in 1947. The rare visionary was full of ideas, courage and determination to address these issues head on. He initiated the revolutionary cooperative movement of farmers to achieve the impossible – “integrated holistic sustainable rural development”. He aimed at realizing “Gram Swaraj” in true letter and spirit. The cooperative movement of farmers led by him, aimed at the issues of agriculture, livestock development and agrobased industry (1948), primary, secondary and collegiate education (1964) and cooperative banking (1972). All these initiatives started transforming the draught prone backward village towards the path of integrated sustainable rural development – social, political and economical. This realistic cooperative model was appreciated by one and all, across the nation.

In order to address the issues of comprehensive rural health care, he established the Pravara Medical Trust in 1972, Pravara Rural Hospital in 1976 at Loni and several rural health centres in the periphery.

For this illustrious social work and sacrifice, Government of India honored him with the award of “Padmashri” in 1962. Pune University conferred on him the honorary D.Lit in 1978 and established a Chair in his name to undertake research in rural development (1981). Mahatma Phule Krishi Vidyapeeth conferred on him the honorary D.Sc. in 1979.



Film Division of India presented a documentary film on his achievement entitled “Shoulder to Shoulder” in 1953. Veteran Girish Karnad has directed a documentary “Sweet Revolution” in 1986, based on his accomplishments. Shri Rajamangal Vedekar and Shri. Shivajirao Sawant have written biographic books (1977/1985) on the life and mission of this illustrious leader. We offer our tributes to this rare visionary.

Development, Consolidation and Expansion of Cooperative Movement:

The mission and ideas of this great visionary was further developed and nurtured by his son **Dr. Balasaheb Vikhe Patil**, Padmabhushan Awardee, Parliamentarian (8 times), Statesman, humble social worker and a visionary leader of the masses. He continued the cooperative movement for integrated rural development and further strengthened comprehensive rural health care. To meet the national requirement for qualified health professionals, PMT established a medical college (1984), dental college (1989), college of physiotherapy (1997) and college of nursing (1998), all on one unitary campus at Loni, offering health professional education and health care. Unique centres entitled “Centre for Social Medicine” and Centre for Biotechnology were established in 2001 to undertake research and extension activities.

Genesis of the University:

In order to achieve the integrated holistic approach in health care, education and research, Pravara Medical Trust (PMT) took positive steps towards the establishment of a Deemed to be



University (with the approval of UGC, MHRD, GOI) by bringing all of its colleges and units of health education and tertiary medical hospital under one ambit/ umbrella, in 2003. Thus, the Deemed to be University was born at Loni-“**Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS-DU)**”, a unique feature in Indian professional education system in a rural India. The governance, leadership and management of PIMS-DU are as per regulations governing deemed to be universities, notified by the UGC from time to time (UGC institution deemed to be universities regulations).

Befitting to the vision and mission of the parent trust, PIMS-DU is imparting quality professional health education at global level and tertiary speciality health care at Loni as well as at doorsteps of 234+ villages spread over 13 talukas and 3 districts with a catchment area of lacs of population of Maharashtra state. Our rural health care, extension and community health outreach activities have received International and National appreciation and recognition.

Growth and Development of the University:

PIMS-DU is located on a spacious and green unitary campus of 115 acres at Loni, developed as per the master plan and land scaping, housing all the 6 constituent units and its rural hospital. It has state of the art buildingblock's for academicandco-academicprogrammes,multispecialty tertiary medical and dental hospitals as well as residential facility for students and staff in the campus, all within a walkable distance. It is a near cent percent residential campus with all the basic amenities and facilities, round the clock, ensuring a home away from the home. It is providing a good multispecialty hospital for enriching clinical resource and care, central library, IT facilities, safety, security, discipline and basic amenities 24x7(water, electricity, maintenance) in a rural area, a real practice of “PURA”. It has recruited qualified and experienced staff as per norms of statutory bodies. We have encouraged research through funds, facilities, and incentives resulting in significant good number of publications and collaborative research projects and clinical trials. PIMS-DU publishes its own ISSN peer reviewed medical journal. We have collaboration with 25+ international and 50+ national institutions and industries. Teachers and students

have visited foreign universities on scholarship/ fellowship through Lineus Palme Exchange Accord and Erasmus+ scheme (only the private deemed university from India included in this scheme). It has attracted 200+ students and faculty from 50+ foreign universities for research and training. Centre for Social Medicine act as Mother NGO and a liasoning body for government and semi government organizations and national health schemes. PIMS-DU has a sound financial management and governance system with accountability, transparency and integrity. Annual convocations are held regularly since 2007. So far 14 convocations have been organized. We are proud for having contributed qualified and competent, health professional, human resource to the national development (**1301** medical doctors, **656** medical specialists, **902** dentists, **222** dental specialists, **503** nurses, **104** nursing specialists, **426** physiotherapists, **132** specialists in physiotherapy, **181** biotechnologists, **21** public health specialists, **31** Ph.D. holders, a total of



4479 graduates and postgraduates). Our students are enriched with good clinical and community health knowledge, skills and competence. We are proud of our “pravarites” serving in India and abroad.

Road Ahead:

Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences – Deemed to be University, aspires to be “*The Centre of Excellence*” in Medical, Dental and allied Health Science education and is committed to improve health standards of this rural region. PIMS-Deemed to be University is making every possible effort to provide globally competent higher education and service to the rural society with a focus on empowerment of rural people for sustainable growth and development.

With the benign blessings of Padmashri Dr. Vitthalrao Vikhe Patil and Padmabhushan Dr. Balasaheb Vikhe Patil, Founder, President & Managing Trustee, PMT and under the guidance and leadership of Hon’ble Dr. Vijay Kelkar, Padmavibhushan Awardee, Chancellor, PIMS-DU, we are marching towards our goal – to create “A Healthy Society”.

PIMS-DU has grown over the years since its establishment in 2003 and recorded developmental milestones. It strives for global excellence. We believe in expansion, consolidation as well to grow and develop ahead to achieve global excellence, as per global and national expectations, trends and challenges.

We believe in continuous improvement and much ahead towards excellence in all our endeavors. Hence we subject ourselves for continuous regulation and monitoring by statutory bodies – MCI, DCI, INC and UGC. We subjected ourselves for assessment by NAAC in 2017 and got accredited at ‘A’ grade with CGPA 3.17. We also subjected ourselves for UGCs Review of Deemed University in 2017 with a good commendation for our significant growth and development.

Padmashree Dr. Vitthalrao Vikhe Patil, an enlightened peasant cared deeply for the well-being of the poor and the disadvantaged who were suffering greatly due to the lack of qualified medical help in this remote rural part of Maharashtra.

The Pravara Medical Trust was established in 1972 as a part of promotive efforts of an Integrated Rural Development Model (widely known as PRAVARA MODEL). With the vision to "Improve the quality of life" of the rural people, especially women and children by providing comprehensive health care to the village people. The promoters of the Trust were fully aware of the fact that health is an integral component of overall development. While the network of industrial, educational and "People"s Organizations" were being promoted in the area, an integrated comprehensive health care system had become imperative for achieving this goal.

Over a period, the area of service has been widened because of the emergence of a full-fledged Medical Complex. Today the complex caters to the health needs of entire Ahmednagar and the neighboring districts of Nashik, Beed, Aurangabad, Dhule and Pune. However, the other services of the model, including medical education, training and research have been spread at National as well as International levels.

The Idea of a University



Establishment of University:

Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences Deemed to be University was established under Section (3) of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act 1956 on 29th September, 2003 by Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development vide notification No. F.9-11/2000-U-3.

Part of a Rural Development Model:

Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed to be University) is unique as it is not a standalone institution, but it is a part of the Rural Development model, which has a goal of “Sustainable Development through Integrated and Holistic Approach”.

Objectives:

The objectives for which 'the University' established are:

1) To Promote and provide

- iii) Appropriate, Innovative, Need Based Programmers of teaching and learning which shall be student centered, problem-based, community oriented in Under graduate, Post graduate and doctoral levels so as to set a high standard of Medical, Health, Allied Sciences, Humanities, Science, Arts, Commerce, Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Education etc. and its interdisciplinary related areas with the prior approval of the UGC/Government of India.
 - iv) Research relevant to current and emerging fields of Medicine, Health and Allied Sciences, Humanities, Science, Arts, Commerce, Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Education and its interdisciplinary related areas.
 - v) Opportunities for the integration of formal and non formal learning with practical experience in medical and health sciences with other areas of human development, such as Humanities, Science, Arts, Commerce, Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Education etc. and its interdisciplinary related areas.
 - vi) Programmes of extension work in the fields of Medicine, Human Health and Allied Sciences, Humanities, Science, Arts, Commerce, Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Education etc. and their inter- disciplinary areas to achieve the overall human development, within the country and abroad.
 - vii) Opportunities to facilitate collaborations, networking with International and National level Universities / Institutes / Organizations / Foundations for promotion, advancement and sharing of academic and research knowledge and activities in Medicine, Health, Allied Sciences, Humanities, Science, Arts, Commerce, Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Education and their inter- disciplinary areas for development of mankind in India and abroad.
 - viii) All possible arrangements for national and global participation in the fields of Medicine, Health Management and Allied Sciences, Humanities, Science, Arts, Commerce, Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Education etc. and their inter- disciplinary areas.
2. To function as a Global level learning resource center in the fields of Medicine, Health, Management and Allied Sciences.
 3. To serve and work towards improvement and development of rural life and the general population
 4. To accomplish the mission and vision enunciated by the founders of the "Pravara Medical Trust, Loni"
 5. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the objects of 'the University.
 6. To undertake all such activities as may be incidental and necessary or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects of 'the University' referred to or implied above.

Rural Nature of the University:

Loni is an obscure village situated in a drought prone area of Ahmednagar District (Maharashtra State), far away



from the metropolitan cities and industrial zones. The Deemed to be University and its all constituent institutions

are located in this village Loni, a single campus. Loni is a village with Gram-Panchayat having 35,022 population as per 2011 census. The Taluka place, Rahata is 20 kms away and the district headquarter, Ahmednagar is 70 kms away. The nearest railway station, Belapur is 25 kms away. The Manmad Railway Junction is 85 kms. & the nearest airport, Aurangabad and Shirdi are 130 kms and 20 kms away respectively.

Health care as a component of overall development:

Health is an important component of this Comprehensive Rural Development Model. Overall development is achieved through healthy individuals and families. Poverty, illiteracy, diseases and inertia among the poor people are inter-linked by forces, which need to be broken for the sustainable development. Therefore, a "Comprehensive Rural Health Care System" was evolved to meet the health care needs of the rural community and was an integral part of the on-going developmental activities of agriculture, agro-based industries, rural financing and education.

Genesis of University:

The origin of establishing an University extends in the developmental model evolved by visionary Padmashree Dr. Vitthalrao Vikhe Patil, which is based on the integrated, holistic approach to solve the problems of rural people. Loni was an obscure village situated in a drought prone area of Ahmednagar District (Maharashtra State), far away from the metropolitan cities and industrial zones.

While working with the rural masses, Padmashree Dr. Vitthalrao Vikhe Patil realized the urgent need for organized activities in many social areas to build a healthy, industrious and prosperous society. A comprehensive rural health care model was the natural consequence of this realisation. In a society where health care facilities were inadequate and inaccessible to the poor, the Pravara Medical Trust - the parent body of this Deemed to be University was established in 1972 in a village called Loni.

The Pravara Medical Trust, the parent trust of the university started providing primary and secondary level medical care from 1976 with the establishment of 100-bed hospital. Over a period of time, the Pravara Rural Hospital grew into a 1275-bedded multi disciplinary, super specialty medical institute with other ancillary facilities. The hospital has now emerged as a referral-teaching institute for this region providing health care covering 25 lakhs people.

This University has the same status as that of other Statutory Universities in India. The degrees, diplomas and certificates awarded by the University have approval of the Government of India, Govt. of Maharashtra and other states as well as the University Grants commission (UGC), Medical Council of India (MCI) Dental Council of India (DCI), All India Physiotherapists Association (AIPA) Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) and Indian Nursing Council (INC).



The University is unique in more than one way. It is specialized in Medical and Health Sciences with a dedication to serve the society as a Center of Excellence with emphasis on socially meaningful medical Education, Health Care and Research.

The Institution has received accolades from His Excellency Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, President of India for the pioneer work done in the field of integrated rural Development and appreciated the participative model of Integrated Rural Development followed at Loni as Role Model for the development of Rural India and has been referred by his Excellency as operative model of **PURA**- Providing Urban Amenities to Rural Area. We have further strengthened community oriented medical education methodology through which students interact with rural masses and study their health problems and socio-economic development, throughout their graduation and Post- graduation-training period.

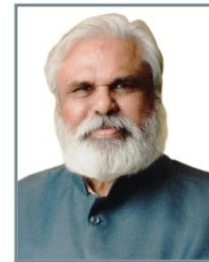

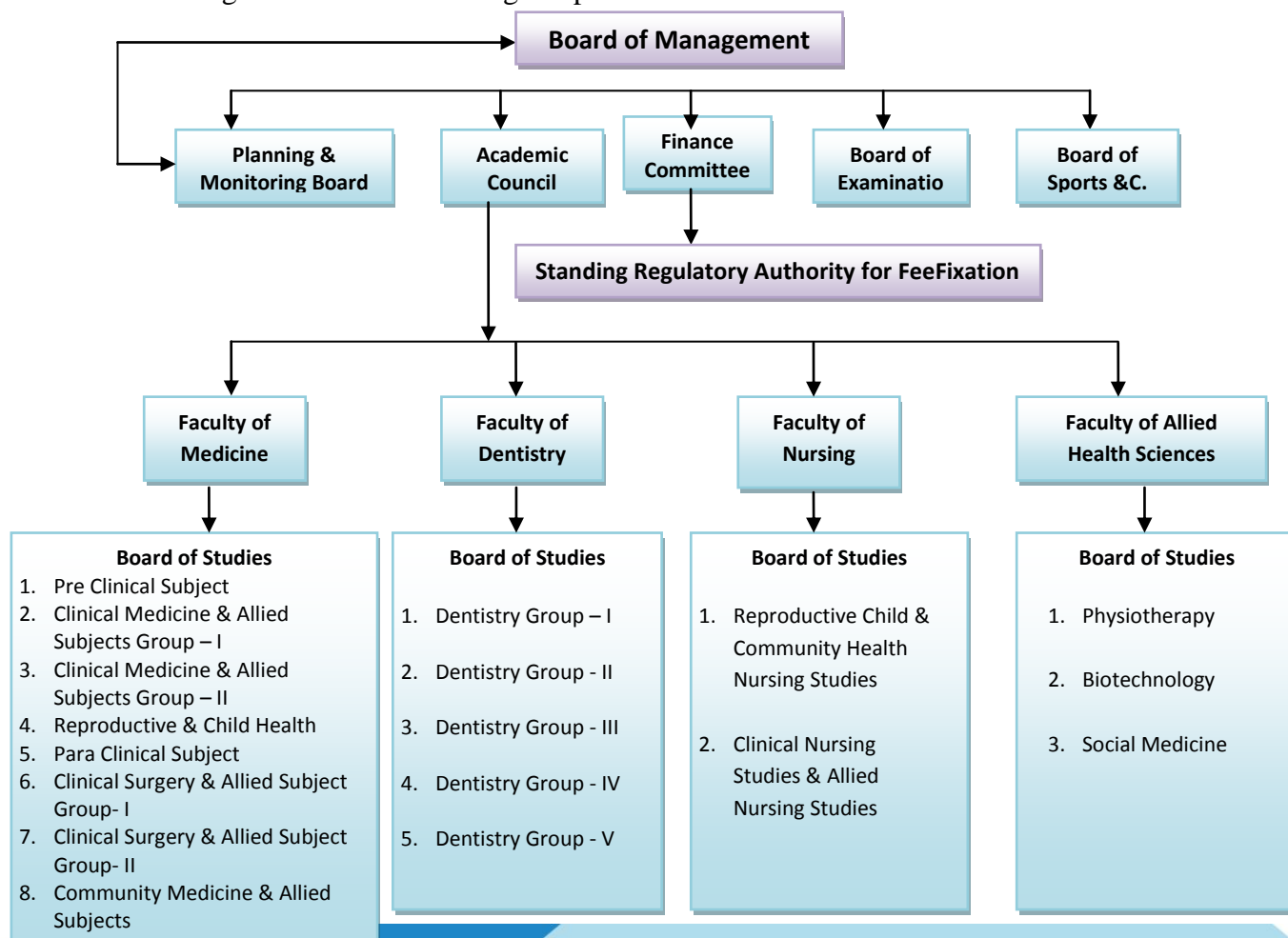
Aspects of Governance

1. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences is registered under Societies Registration Act 1860 and formulated a Memorandum of Association and Rules based on model and guidelines prescribed by UGC. The MOA was revised as per Regulations for Deemed University (2010) and submitted for approval to UGC.

Introduction

A Brief Report of PIMS-DU

With the permission of Chair, Let me present a brief report of PIMS-DU- 2019-20

For the perusal of our Chief Guest, Invitees and Parents, let me say a few words above PMT and PIMS-DU

PMT was established in 1972 by our visionary leaders at Loni to provide rural health care and health profession education . PMT established Pravara Rural Hospital in 1974 , RMC in 1984, RDC in 1989, COPT in 1997, CON in 2000 , CBT in 2000 and CSM in 2001.

With the permission of UGC, PIMS-DU was established as a Deemed to be University on 29th September 2003 at Loni consisting of six constituent Colleges. **Today we are celebrating the 14th Convocation of this prestigious institution and to review the growth, development and march ahead.** PIMS-DU offers UG PG, PGD, PhD and other Diploma and certificate programmes under the Faculties of Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing and Allied health Sciences (PT, Public health and Biotechnology). We have the recognition MCI, DCI, INC and MNC and UGC and MS OTPT Council for all our academic programmes. PRH is a Multi Speciality Tertiary Hospital in a rural area with 1275 Beds, state of the art facilities – CCL, Radiology and Imaging , Onco – Radiotherapy, 18 modular OTs, ICUs, Blood Bank, CSSD and other facilities PIMS-DU has a unitary lush green campus spread over 115 acres, developed as per the master plan and land scaping, hosting all the institutions, hospitals, hostels, residential quarters, guest houses and 24 x 7 basic amenities of water, electricity and security.

We have maintained global standards in our healthcare and health profession education. Hence NAAC has reaccredited PIMS-DU at A .

In 2018 and 2019, PIMS-DU participated in NIRF Ranking of MHRD, GOI and was placed in Rank band of 101 – 150 among 1000 + universities in India.

2. Successfully organized a unique, first-of-its kind, National Conference on “Tribal Health Research – Issues, Challenges and Opportunities” on 19-21st September 2019 in Collaboration with Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India, Tribal Research and Training Institute (TRTI), Government of Maharashtra, Pune and WHO India. The conference was inaugurated by Dr. Abhay Bang and concluding remarks were given by Shri Deepak Khandekar, Secretary, MoTA, Govt of India and Sou. Manisha Verma, Principal Secretary, Tribal Development Dept, Govt of Maharashtra. As many as 340 delegates, 6 keynote addresses, 16 plenary and 65 thematic speakers representing 20 states have participated in the conference. III. Development at Colleges and Directorate

A. Rural Medical College

1. **MCI inspections were Successful** [MCI inspection for renewal of 200 MBBS seats and renewal and compliance for PG seats in OBGY, Ophthalmology, General Surgery, and Radiation Oncology was successful.] **The total PG seats have been now increased from 76 to 93.**
2. Competency Based Curriculum has been introduced successfully for MBBS student's w.e.f. 2019-20 batch.
3. RMC was selected as a Training Center by GOM – GOI for Community Health Officers. RMC trained the batch of 120 AYUSH Doctor and Nurses as Community Health Officer (CHO) for 6 months under “Ayushman Bharat” scheme of Prime Minister of India. Now second batch has been admitted.
4. Around twenty rare surgeries in different specialties were performed by our Doctors.
5. B.Sc. in Radiation and Imaging has been introduced with the approval of AERB.
6. AERB has also given approval for the introduction of B.Sc. in Radiotherapy

B :- Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam College of Physiotherapy

1. The Spinal Cord Injury Rehabilitation Centre was established at COPT with the expert advice from Dr. Katerzina and Dr. Inka of Karolinska Institute Sweden. It is now named after Mother Soil Rajmata Smt. Sindhutai Vikhe Patil Spinal Cord Injury Rehabilitation Centre.
2. Wheel Chair Provisions and Services to spinal cord injury patients as per WHO guidelines were provided through an MOU with Motivation India an NGO of global repute.

C :- College of Nursing

1. Got permission from DMER and MNC to enhance UG seats from 50 to 100. Accordingly admission were made.



D :- Center for Social Medicine

1. The CSM received nearly **Rs. 100 lakhs during 2019** towards extra-mural funded Action Research Projects sponsored by NACO, UNICEF, Bajaj Foundation and others (in the fields of HIV/AIDS, Emergency Care, Malnutrition & TB, Reproductive Health of Tribal, Minority communities and high risk groups)
2. A PAN India level Research Project was sanctioned to PIMS-DU during December 2019 by Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt o India under the Scheme of “Centre of Excellence”. An initial grant of Rs. 50 lakhs was sanctioned for first six months of the Project. [The objectives of this national projects is for profiling of tribal communities with Geo-tagging, documentation of traditional healing and ethno-medicine practices by various tribal communities in India]
3. A Research Project on documentation of traditional healing practices of [Mahadev Kolhi, Thakar, Khatkari, Warli and Kokana Tribal communities in Pune and Nashik districts of Maharashtra was sanctioned by Tribal Research and Training Institute, Govt of Maharashtra during June 2019, with a funding of Rs. 14 lakhs.
4. Our Rural Health Care Mission through PRH PHCs and THCs was a huge success
 - 267 Multispecialty Screening and Diagnostic Health Check-up camps organized
 - 1.5 Lakh patients treated at PHCs
 - 25,000 Patients treated in Mobile clinics
 - 30,000 Patients treated their motor Bike clinics
 - 470 Emergency patients were brought to PRH through the Motor Bike Ambulance.

Forty years ago, when I studied medicine, India was mainly interested with problems like malnutrition, malaria, mortality. When India became independent, 32 years was life expectancy at birth; today it is 68 years. But at the same time, as the life expectancy increases and mortality increases, you have the newer challenge. You now face triple burden of disease. The residue of the malnutrition, malaria and child mortality era, to some extent, these problems continue, but you also have a newer epidemic of non-communicable diseases diabetes, hypertension, obesity, stroke, heart disease and cancer and the third burden of mental health problems depression, anxiety, stress and addiction. You are blessed with more difficult challenges. You are blessed with bigger responsibility. Life awaits you very very eagerly those 600 soldiers who entered the life today will be facing those problems, I am sure, will be victorious.

Your third gift is that you have richer resources compared to my generation. Not only financial resources, India has been fairly successful in economic growth, you have larger resources. You have more technologies starting from radiology, biotechnology, genetics, information technology, digital technology and in the globalized world, there are infinite opportunities open for you. In short, you enter the world of real life with more possibilities, hence you deserve a huge congratulations. When you will step out of this convocation hall today with certificate in your hand, your name and your degree will be written on the one side of the certificate, but the other side of the certificate will be blank. You will come out of this degree certificate and a blank page with a blank cheque of life in your hand. It is your responsibility, it is your prerogative to write on that blank cheque. You will write your future on that blank cheque. So, while I congratulate you, but I pose you the fourth question and that is what will you do with your life? What will you write on that blank cheque of your life? You have come into this world only once. You are on a once in a lifetime journey. There is no once more yet. So, whatever you do with your life, I just urge you, your life is too precious. You have it only once. Do not sell it for the sake of money. That is the stupidest bargain that you can do. In this world, money is almost in finite, we do not know even globally probably 18 trillion dollars, that might be the value of global capital. Money is infinite, while life is only once and therefore, it is far more precious than money. Money, yes it is important. You need money. Money provides means to life, means to service, but it does not provide the meaning to life. Find out the meaning for your life. It is your life. It is your responsibility and you are privileged to provide a meaning to your life.

Viktor Frankl, the general psychologist, in his very famous book “The man searched for meaning” says it beautifully. Look, all of us are so pre-occupied with the details of life; will I have a two-bedroom house or three-bedroom house? Will I have a Honda car or some other car? Will I have this much bank balance or that much bank balance? Will I have 10 sarees or 20 sarees? Will I have three suites or five suites? These are all the details of how of living. How



will I live? That is not the fundamental question. Viktor Frankl says “Those who know the why of living have no problems about the how of living.” If you have a powerful “why of living”, the purpose for your life, material things becomes immaterial. A life full of difficulties and challenges become beautiful. Thorns become roses with fragrance. Do not forget to ask this question to yourself. “Why am I living? What for? What is the purpose of my life?” and discover the why of your living. Now naturally, you would ask me where will I find the purpose of my life? About 74 years ago, my father who had earned five gold medals during his study of Economics, Mahatma Gandhi had called him to become a professor of economics in the college which Gandhiji had started to workup. The new Indian government decided to send him to US for studying the Economics further. His admission, scholarship, travel documents, visa, everything was done. A week before his scheduled departure, he went to see Mahatma Gandhi. Gandhiji was sitting in his room of the ashram. Gandhiji was sitting and writing something. He went in, He bowed to him. Gandhiji looked up, asked him “How do you do? come Prof Bang?” He said, “Bapu, I am moving to US for studying Economics further, seek your blessings.” The old man looked at my father. My father was a young man of 28 at that time. so, he looked at him for a few seconds and uttered only one sentence and he said it in Hindi, so I will say in Hindi “Aqa-Saas~ saIKnaa hO tao Baart ko dohatao mao jaaAao” and that’s it. My father quietly came out and right outside that room, he tore away his admission and travel documents and within one month went for living in a village called Bargadi to live like a farmer and learn the economics of rural area. I was born when my parents were living in that village. I would say, I was blessed with this beginning of life. Later on, he became a freedom fighter and even went to jail. So come back to our question, “Where will you find the purpose of your life?” I would urge, go where the problems are and not where the facilities are. When we decide our place of working, place of living, we are always looking for facilities and conveniences. Television haogaa ko nahI ? Internet service haogaa ko nahI ? Airport iktnaa dUr haogaa? Mall or film theatre at what distance? We are looking for facilities. We are looking for not only living facility, but also working facilities. The problem of the places with these facilities are that they do not need you. You become a problem there. Because everybody wants to go and live and work in the places with facilities, there are no problems to be solved. You become the problem there and they tell you to stand in a long queue with an application form in your hand. “mauJao BaI jagah do dao” There is no space for you. You are not needed there and you are standing there in the queue. The first mistake that we do is that we go where the facilities are. There you are standing in the queue, at the end to get admission in to a place with facilities. It might be Mumbai, it might be Delhi, it might be Pune. You are at the end of the queue. I urge you go where the problems are and not where the facilities are. Vinoba Bhave has given a wonderful strategic masters’ stroke for such situation. Imagine you are standing in the queue in the end, long queue. There are 10 million people probably seeking employment in this country. He said it Marathi, so I will first say in Marathi. So, he said “jagaakDo paz ifrvaa mhNajao jaga tumacyaa pazISaI]Bao rahIla.” Just turn the direction by 180 degrees and you become the pioneer, you become the first.” What a masterstroke! Instead of waiting at the end of the queue for your entrance job and promotion, turn your goalpost by 180 degrees, go where the problems are, you become the pioneer, you become the first, let a new queue start with you. Thirty years ago or now almost thirty five years ago, Rani (my wife) and I had returned from the US. We decided to go to Gadchiroli. “The



kalapani of Maharashtra” and I must say, if I stand right here before you today and if you honor me today it is only because 35 years ago, we decided to go Gadchiroli. We discovered Gadchiroli. I urge you to discover Gadchiroli, discover your kurukshetra. Huge challenges invite you, they await you because you all belong to health sciences discipline. Let me mention only three and this is not an exhaustive list, but I am just mentioning three: There are nearly hundreds of primary district in this country; nearly thousands of primary village or tribal block and if you know or you may not know that there are nearly 100 million tribal people in this country. They have the worst health status. they have the worst living status they have the worst education status, the worst economic status, the poorest access to health care, high proportion of malnutrition, highest malaria deaths and tuberculosis deaths amongst them. They have the highest IMR and under five mortality rate. As backward and neglected section of the society, they need you. There is Akole block in Ahmednagar district, there is Bhandardara, there is Nandurbar, there is Dhule, there is Weleghat, there is Gadchiroli in Maharashtra and these are areas of poorest tribal people. Who if not you will go there? What can be the better purpose of life than going there and cheering their life. Every year lakhs of children die in India. Death of a child, it cannot be the worst human tragedy than death of a child. Look all of us have enjoyed some years of life. We had had some opportunities to enjoy life. That child has not even seen that beauty of life and in one stroke 70 years of life span of that the child is deprived of. What can be the bigger tragedy? How can we step aside and look at those lakhs of children dying every year. On the cover page of an international News, magazine, one photograph was published nearly three decades ago. You may not have seen it, but that was a photograph of a generation. Some where in Ethiopia, in early 90s, this photographer took a photograph of a black child, very malnourished, exhausted, tired and child is lying along in one place. It is sitting, crawling and is bending forwards, touching its head to the ground, almost given up, no hope of life and then at a near distance a vulchure is waiting for its pray. That photograph received the best photograph of the year award, an international award, but the photographer committed suicide six months later. “What did I do for that child?” That was the question. “I took the photograph” I got the international award, but what about that child? Lakhs of children are dying every year in India waiting for you. There are millions of women in India whose husband drink. Husband’s drinking is the worst form of tragedy for an Indian woman. I have met a rural area’s women who were describing how their husbands drink. One woman said “my husband died of drinking.” Another woman said “Why does not my drunken husband die early.” Alcoholism of husband is the only thing in India that Indian woman would aspire that she would become widow, earlier is better. Such a curse it is for women of India! Selling alcohol is a big business, and it is a fashion. Science tells us, the global recording, the most recent one available tells us that tobacco and alcohol are the two of their topmost seven causes of death, disease and disability world over. So, tobacco and alcohol are no longer acceptable and they are the cholera and plagues of 21st century. You must take them seriously. Women everywhere in India are struggling to find solution against alcohol. Health science and Health professional need to think now. That the whole community of health science need to revolutionize its thinking about alcohol. We have done that about tobacco. During 1950, and 60s, for the first time the research outcome showed us that the consumption of tobacco smoking is linked with lung cancer and the time started turning. About tobacco, you may not know, but let me tell you that zero level of drinking now



hereafter, science tells us that the safe level of drinking hereafter is 0. Even a drop of alcohol is harmful for health. So, with this newer scientific evidence, we the people in the threat of health, have to join hands with those crores of women in India who are struggling against alcohol. I just mentioned three challenges. There are several such challenges waiting. Look, as a medical student or nursing or physiotherapy, biotechnology students, all of us are enabled by technology. More the technology utilization, better will be the health care and better medicine. But actually more technology means more cost, more cost, more dependence. There is another way of looking at the medical care and health sciences. What is its purpose? 35 years ago when we had just come back from US, I met an old man in Delhi. Surprisingly, he looked little like Mahatma Gandhi, but this was in the year 1984, so it could not have been Mahatma Gandhi. But he asked me, Abhay, you have come back from US; I said yes. So, he said, “What did you study?” I said “public health.” He asked me “what is Indian definition of public health? What is an Indian definition of health and I was flabbergasted. I knew WHO definition. I told the same & explained it out. He said that is all waste and bluff. What is Indian definition of health? No, I did not know. He asked, what is the Sanskrit or Hindi word for healthy person? I said “swasth.” The Indian definition of health is hidden in that word itself. “jaaao sva mao isqat hO ,vah svasqa hO ! What a beauty! This country, this culture has defined health not by how many technologies, how many antibiotics or how much money do you spend on health care. It has defined health by saying that health is freedom. Health is autonomy. Health is self reliance. Health means not being dependent on anybody else. So how can we pursue for health be something which degenerates more and reason more dependence. By increasing medical care, probably we are generating more Asvasqa more and more dependent on medical care system, lifelong dependence. The richest and the most powerful country in the world, US, spends 17% of its GDP on medical care. Look, it is American GDP. It is already several times more than Indian per capita GDP. On the top of it, they spend 17% of their GDP and yet a large number of people are left out of medical care. The medical costs are escalating. I am very sorry to know that India, unfortunately, is following the American model of health care. More technology, more hospitals, more costs, more dependence and many more. Some authorities does say that the medical care in India generates 4 to 6 crore population of “poor” every year. We make 4 to 6 crore people poorer every year; we have to avoid this tragedy. Are there any answers? Can we search for alternatives and solutions ? and the answer is within us. Again the direction is hidden in the word “svasqa.” Some need to generate health and self reliance, not dependence and more critical care. You will be fortunate individuals to be able to pursue big challenges. Pursue these challenges, find out solutions to them, go where the problems are, live and love the people, combine people and science together and you will to the miracle. We all remember Isaac Newton, a landmark discovery of gravity, how did it happen? Newton saw an apple fruit falling and combined his curiosity, spirit of enquiry and thinking to it and the ordinary event of apple fruit falling became a source of enormous historical discovery – discovery of gravity. But let me tell you, everyday 100s of apples are falling in this country in the villages and tribal areas. There is no Newton sitting there. That is a problem. Among People, nearly 15% of adults in this country have low backache, what a challenge for the students of physiotherapy? One third of India consumes tobacco, what a challenge for the people in dentistry? For every discipline, for everybody of you, some apple is falling somewhere, you are not there. That is a tragedy. I will



say go where the apples are falling and you make new discoveries. You will naturally ask me but is it possible? How does it happen? In everybody's life, one "Pietermaritzburg" Station happens. I do not know if you remember this name, Pietermaritzburg. It is that Railway Station in South Africa, in 1894, this young lawyer called Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi was thrown out of the Railway Coach and he spent the entire night on that railway platform. He was humiliated, he was afraid, he was cold. He thought "this is not a country for us; let me go back to India. But then he decided, "No, I will fight". I will fight for injustice" and he remained there and we know the history. When 100 years were completed for this occasion, I had the huge fortune of going to Pietermaritzburg and sitting on the same platform and I closed my eyes and I could see young Mohandas shivering there in that cold and wet platform. On that station, a transformation happened. What transformation? 100 years later when this event had had happened, after that 100 years in 1994, a statue of Mahatma Gandhi was erected in that very city, Pietermaritzburg. Another great man, Nelson Mandela recalled it when he visited the said station. He said, "Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi, when you came 100 years ago in this country, we were ourselves were in slavery. We did not recognize you. But then, South Africa did one thing at least. He says 100 years ago, a young bumbling lawyer called Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi came to this country, 20 years later, we send back a Mahatma. Mahatmas are born at the Pietermaritzburg station. I wish once such Pietermaritzburg station happens in each of your's life. Twenty years from now, I hope, we will meet you again and ask you the question what did you do in which you find satisfaction and solace.

I congratulate all the young grandaunts on this auspicious day. I express my thanks to Dr. Vijay L. Kelkar, the Chancellor, Dr. Rajendra Vikhe Patil, the Pro Chancellor and Dr. Y.M. Jayaraj, the Vice Chancellor for the honor bestowed on me.

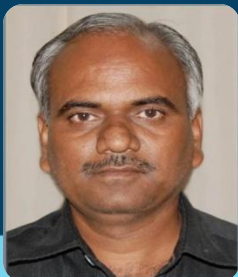

Introduction

In pursuance of its Action Plan for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore proposes that every accredited institution should establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a quality sustenance measure. IQAC – Vision

To ensure quality culture as the prime concern for the Higher Education Institutions through institutionalizing and internalizing all the initiatives taken with internal and external support.

Objective

The primary aim of IQAC is

- To develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution.
- To promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

Strategies

IQAC shall evolve mechanisms and procedures for

- a) Ensuring timely, efficient and progressive performance of academic, administrative and financial tasks;
- b) Relevant and quality academic/ research programmes;
- c) Equitable access to and affordability of academic programmes for various sections of society;
- d) Optimization and integration of modern methods of teaching and learning;
- e) The credibility of assessment and evaluation process;
- f) Ensuring the adequacy, maintenance and proper allocation of support structure and services;
- g) Sharing of research findings and networking with other institutions in India and abroad.



Functions

Some of the functions expected of the IQAC are:

- a) Development and application of quality benchmarks
- b) Parameters for various academic and administrative activities of the institution;
- c) Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive to quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process;
- d) Collection and analysis of feedback from all stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes;
- e) Dissemination of information on various quality parameters to all stakeholders;
- f) Organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles;
- g) Documentation of the various programmes/activities leading to quality improvement;
- h) Acting as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of best practices;
- i) Development and maintenance of institutional database through MIS for the purpose of maintaining /enhancing the institutional quality;
- j) Periodical conduct of Academic and Administrative Audit and its follow-up
- k) Preparation and submission of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) as per guidelines and parameters of NAAC.

Benefits

IQAC will facilitate / contribute to

- a) Ensure clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards quality enhancement;
- b) Ensure internalization of the quality culture;
- c) Ensure enhancement and coordination among various activities of the institution and institutionalize all good practices;
- d) Provide a sound basis for decision-making to improve institutional functioning;
- e) Act as a dynamic system for quality changes in HEIs;
- f) Build an organized methodology of documentation and internal communication.

Composition of the IQAC

IQAC may be constituted in every institution under the Chairmanship of the Head of the institution with heads of important academic and administrative units and a few teachers and a few distinguished educationists and representatives of local management and stakeholders.

The composition of the IQAC will depend on the size and complexity of the institution, accordingly the representation of teachers may vary. It helps the institutions in planning and monitoring. IQAC also gives stakeholders or beneficiaries a cross-sectional participation in the institution's quality enhancement activities.

The membership of such nominated members shall be for a period of two years. The IQAC should meet at least once in every quarter. The quorum for the meeting shall be two-third of the total number of members. The agenda,



minutes and Action Taken Reports are to be documented with official signatures and maintained electronically in a retrievable format.

The composition of the IQAC may be as follows:

1. Chairperson: Head of the Institution
2. Teachers to represent all level (Three to eight)
3. One member from the Management
4. Few Senior administrative officers
5. One nominee each from local society, Students and Alumni
6. One nominee each from Employers /Industrialists/Stakeholders
7. One of the senior teachers as the coordinator/Director of the IQAC

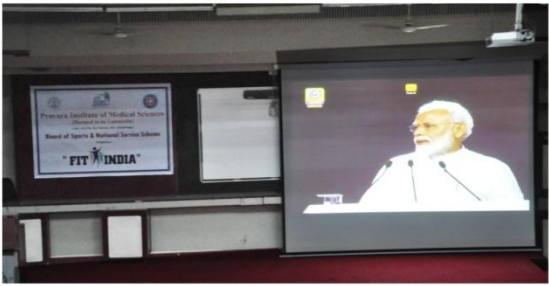

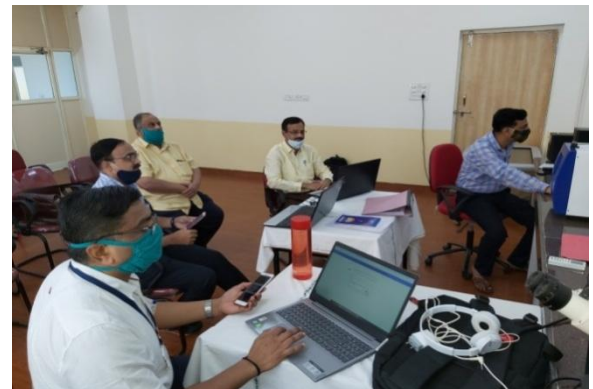
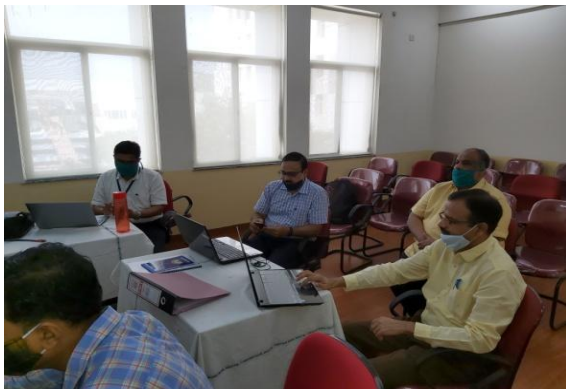

Preamble:

Traditionally the teaching process had been class room based and involves didactic lectures and demonstrations in the class rooms and in the laboratory. This had a drawback of strict time schedules for the classes and at times became monotonous. Although revisions are organized, they are not at the convenience of the learners. Further, the resources available were based on what was available on site and text books in the library.

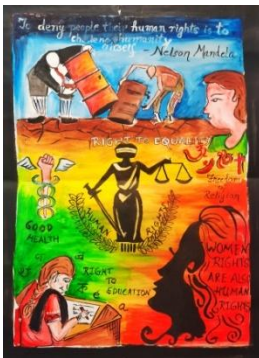

The Intercollegiate Basketball (Men) tournament was organized on 7th December, 2019 and selected team took part in the West Zone Inter University Basketball tournament.

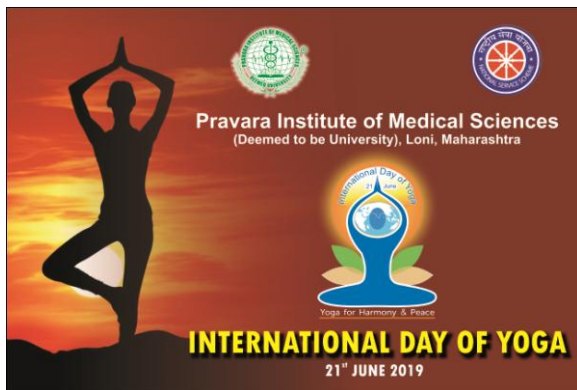

Rural Medical College, established in 1984 as first Private Medical College in Maharashtra and providing care to the underserved rural population as well as offering quality medical education to undergraduates and postgraduates. It is part of “LONI PURA” model appreciated by Ex President of India, His. Excellency Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, Providing Urban Amenities in Rural Area.

1. STUDENTS' ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

- The performance of our students in various MBBS professional examinations was outstanding, as follows:
- The overall pass rate of first, second and third MBBS was between 91.38% to 94.28%

Regarding Post Graduate examinations, the overall pass percentage was 83 % to 100 %.

2. IMPLEMENTATION OF CBME AND INNOVATIONS IN TEACHING

• The new curriculum of “Competency Based Medical Education (CBME)” as directed by MCI has been successfully implemented from the MBBS batch which entered in our RMC in August 2019. Complete syllabus of the first professional subjects as contained in the new CBME, has been displayed on our website and is being religiously followed. Following are the major steps in implementation of CBME in RMC:

- a) Sensitization workshop on CBME was organized for preclinical faculty members on 19/7/2020 in MET hall.
- b) A one month long “Foundation course”, the



first one of its kind to be held for MBBS students and as directed by the MCI was implemented from 1st-31st August 2019. Total 200 students were trained for 175 hours covering various modules as per directives of MCI viz. orientation program, skill training, field visits to health centers, AETCOM , language & computer, sports & extracurricular activities. Faculty members from concerned departments participated enthusiastically to make it a great success.

- c) Sensitization workshop on Assessment in CBME was organized for preclinical faculty on 3/12/2019 in MET hall
- d) Sensitization program on CBME and CISP was organized on 4/9/2020 for paraclinical faculty in Godawari hall, which was also made available online to preclinical and clinical faculty through Microsoft Teams.
- e) MCI/MUHS RC approved CISP II program was successfully organized from 9th -10th October 2020 in which 30 faculty members from all phases were trained. Dr. Anjali N



Shete was the MCI observer.

- f) Rural Medical College became one of the few selected medical colleges in Maharashtra to start the “Community Health Officers (CHO)” training program, in which 120 AYUSH Doctors and BSc. qualified nurses were trained from 1st August 2019, for 6 months in Clinical care and Community health, and will thereafter manage the “Health and Wellness Centers” under the Hon’ble Prime Minister’s “Ayushman Bharat Programme”. CHOs trained in first batch were 120 & Second batch were 27. Most of them got placement in Ahmednagar district.

5. PROGRESS MADE IN PATIENT CARE ACTIVITIES

1. COVID-19 related activities:

a) Dedicated 100 bed COVID hospital with an additional 10 ICU beds was started, 2 km from Institute offering free services under MPJAY scheme to all COVID positive patients. Total COVID patients treated in the facility till Oct 2020 were 486 including 40 critical patients and 8 deaths. Recovery rate was more than 98%.

- b) New diagnostic tests for COVID including TrueNat, RT-PCR, and RAT were started in department of Microbiology. These were duly accredited by NABL and also became ICMR recognised testing Laboratory for COVID testing by TrueNat and by RT-PCR.
- c) An exclusive sample collection center for COVID was started at the western end of the campus with independent access for persons whose sample is to be collected.

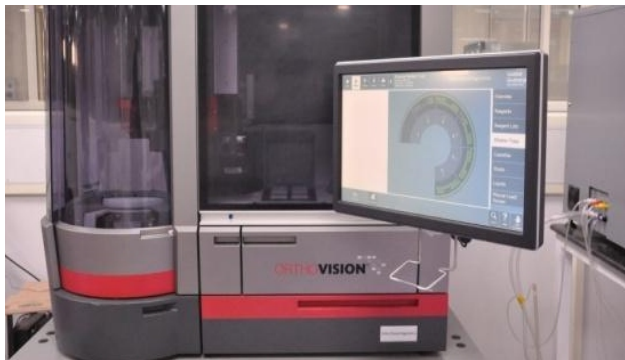

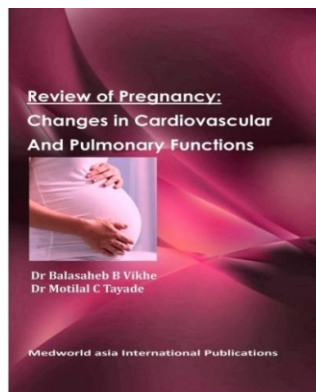
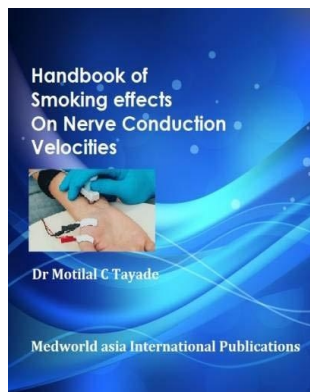

"Interact with your peers, Build new connections,converge the congregations"

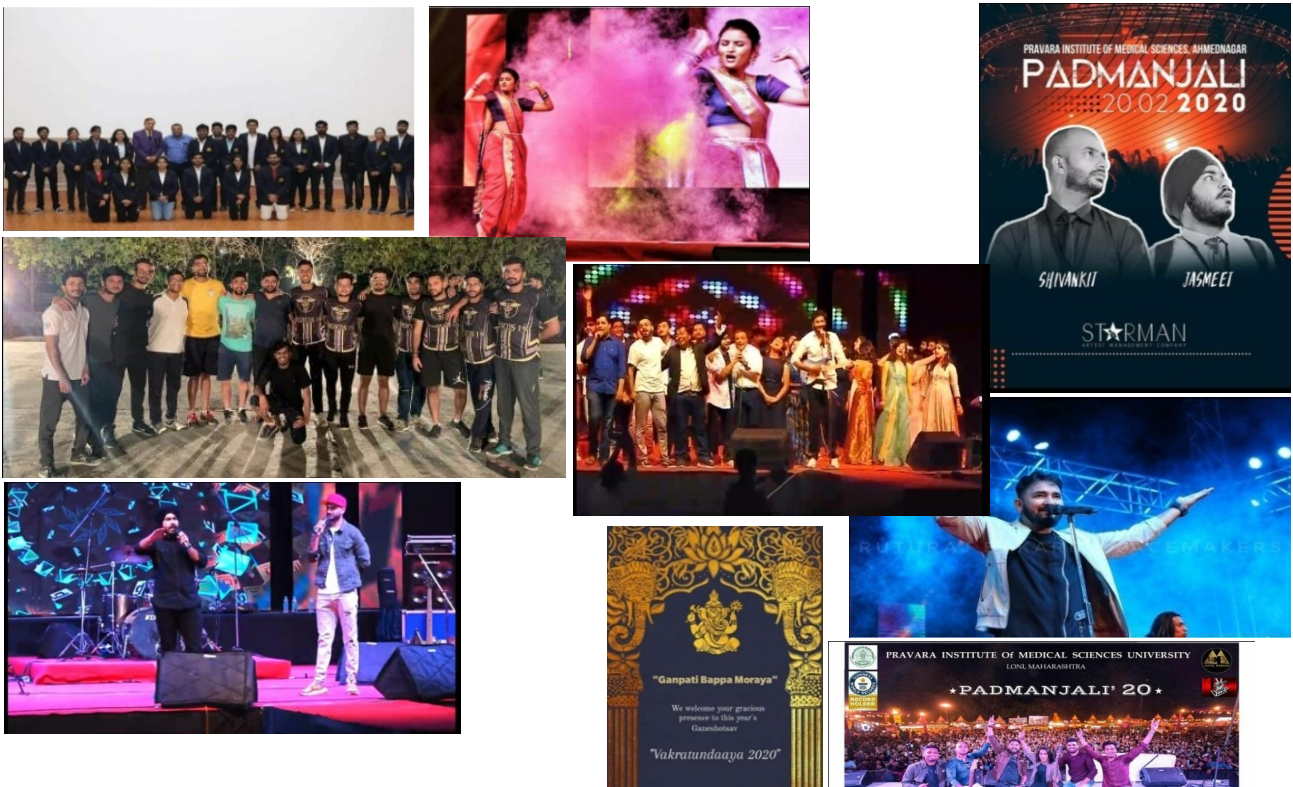

Annual Report 2019-20

Genesis

It gives me immense pleasure to pen the address on Rural Dental College, Loni. RDC has come a long way from its inception in the form of a few chaired Dental Clinic to a huge, multicentric and multispecialty Dental institute. The institute believes in quality Dental education to the students to make them globally competitive and dedicated Dental health services delivered to rural and tribal areas which is appreciated worldwide. The Institute caters an array of dental treatment services to more than 1.2 million populations around Loni, making it one of the premier Dental education hubs in the beautiful state of Maharashtra.

Keeping healthcare as priority for poor and needy people, Pravara Medical Trust established Rural Dental College in 1989 with an intake capacity of 60 admissions per year which was increased to 100 seats in the year 2007. The Dental College was initially affiliated to University of Pune and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik till it became a constituent unit to this Deemed to be University. The departments of



Dental College are Oral Pathology and Microbiology, Orthodontics, Pedodontics, Oral Medicine & Radiology, Public Health Dentistry, Prosthodontics, Periodontology, Conservative Dentistry, Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. All these departments are adequately staffed and equipped as per the norms prescribed by DCI for conducting effective undergraduate & post graduate training.

The College and courses offered are recognized by Dental Council of India (DCI). The College offers post graduate courses (M.D.S.) in the following disciplines: (i) Periodontology (ii) Oral Medicine & Radiology (iii) Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery (iv) Oral Pathology and Microbiology (v) Prosthodontics and Crown & Bridge (vi) Paedodontics & Preventive Dentistry (vii) Orthodontics & Dentofacial orthopedics (viii) Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics. Doctorate of Philosophy (Ph. D) program in Dentistry is also being offered since 2012.



College has a teaching hospital with all specialties of dental surgery which provides routine & specialized diagnostic procedures including Cone Beam Computed Tomography (CBCT), Digital Orthopantomogram (OPG) and Cephalogram and treatment like Maxillofacial and Orthognathic surgery, advanced conservative treatment, aesthetic dentistry, ceramics, cast metal base dentures and Maxillofacial prosthesis. College also provides extension OPD services to nearby villages, which are also attended by the UG & PG students and interns under supervision of senior staff.

Adequate Dental Laboratory facilities are provided for training of undergraduates & postgraduate and also for undertaking research. The students of this dental college are benefited with both high technological dental education as well as simultaneous exposure to the rural population through community-based training. Extensive preclinical and clinical training is imparted to the students at Rural Dental College & Hospital as well as at its well-equipped peripheral center in Rahata.

Teaching-learning process:

Teaching – learning process is the heart of education which decides the fulfillment of aims & objectives of education. With this in mind, the institute has all the infrastructural

facilities and dedicated teaching faculty, which makes the learning student centric. Lecture methods such as interactive teaching, ICT enabled teaching using online palatforms like Microsoft teams, zooms, Google classrooms, Google meet, project based, problem based and evidence based learning etc help the students to understand the subject thoroughly.

All the departments have inbuilt mechanisms like mentor system, identification of slow and advanced learner, academic calendar and

intensive clinical training to achieve desired outcome. The institute is well equipped with lecture halls, seminar rooms, central library, department clinics, Education Communication Media Centre (ECMC), audiovisual aids and central animal resource center. Research

The objective of the dental research is to stimulate interest, debate, discussion and interaction among dentists and specialists of all disciplines within the field of dentistry. The research in dentistry will give the information on clinical developments,



clinical opinions and treatments as well as other key issues of relevance. Every Undergraduate student is encouraged to conduct at least one research project under the guidance of faculty during the 3rd year of BDS.

It is a proud moment for the college as a patent by Dr. Deepak Vikhe (Reader, Prosthodontics) for his invention in Implantology was applied and has been published.



Oral Health Education:

Oral health diagnosis and treatment camps were organized by Public health Dentistry at 13 Schools & 46 Villages/ towns in and around Loni. Total 3977 School Students have been benefited with Oral Health Information by delivering Oral Health Education with the help of models & flow charts by dentist (Interns & Fourth BDS Students) visiting school & making them aware about brushing techniques & how to keep oral cavity, teeth in health by brushing regularly with tooth paste & brush.



Cultural, Sports and extracurricular activities:

The college provides its students numerous opportunities for co-curricular activities to enrich their cultural interests. The college encourages the students to take part in a wide variety of cultural competitions such as singing, dancing, debates, creative writing etc. and hold various cultural activities throughout the year. There is an annual "Padmanjali" during which the official publication "Campus Chronicle" is edited and managed by dental students



Collaborations

Rural Dental College is part of the collaborations developed by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences. At present the university collaborates with a numbers of National and International Universities and organizations. College collaborates nationally with Ministry of Health, Govt. of India, New Delhi, Dist. Health Society, Ahmednagar, Pravara Institute of Research and

Education Natural and Social Sciences, Loni. Collaborations exist internationally with TUFTS University, Boston, Pathfinder International, Boston, USA, Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency Sweden. Currently the collaborations are established with Hebrew University, Jerusalem, Israel and University of Bari, Italy (Implantology and Regenerative Dentistry) and Karolinska Institutet, Sweden. Successful collaboration of the Rural Dental College, Loni with University of Santiago, Spain for the PhD project of Dr. Deepak Vikhe (Reader, Prosthodontics) has been initiated and it is in progress.

Significant Milestone & Achievement:

- As on now 1611 BDS, 201 MDS and 02 PhD students have graduated from Rural Dental College and they are well placed in National and International level.
- Thirty-six students in certificate course in implantology, 95 Dental Mechanics and 118 Dental Hygienist have been cleared by this institution.
- More than 400 research works done by staff and students of Rural Dental College and the results are published in National and International level in last 5 years.
- RDC along with PIMS-DU has been reaccredited as Grade A by NAAC in March 2017
- Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences honoured Dr. Deepak Vikhe (Reader, Dept. of Prosthodontics) with Chancellor's Rolling Trophy of year 2019 for best research award.
- Dr. Deepak Vikhe developed new technique of "DV-PIMS" for grafting I-PRF around dental implant. This technique has been published on Government Patent website and published in Indian Journal of Dental research (Pubmed)



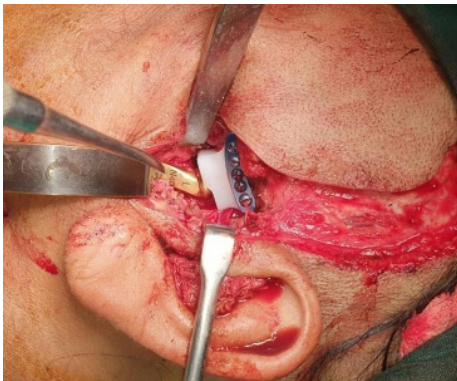

- Workshop on Basic Life Support was conducted on occasion of OMFS day on 12th Feb & 13th Feb 2020 by Dept. of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Rural Dental College. During the workshop, 144 participants were trained by trained faculties on life saving measures.



- Dept. of Orthodontic has organized 32 national level webinars during the lockdown period as an innovative, academic teaching learning resource by eminent speakers in Orthodontia.
- Dr. Sumeet Mishra, Sr. Lecturer from orthodontics has successfully completed 6 FDP's under Ministry of Health, India. Duration of each FDP was minimum of 15 days. He has scored highest marks in MOOCs FDP course out of 9483 scholars and received certificate of achievement by the hands of Hon'ble Dr. Rajendra Vikhe Patil, President of Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Loni.
- A case of Temporomandibular Joint Disorder in an elderly female was operated and reconstructed with TM Joint prosthesis performed by Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Rural Dental College. This kind of surgery is performed in very few centres all over India.



- A case of CGCG of mandible in a young female was operated and reconstructed successfully with free fibula flap using 3-D digital planning by Dept. of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.



- International women's day was celebrated on 8th March 2020 by the Public Health Dentistry. Self-defense techniques were discussed and demonstrated to the girls of Rural dental College.

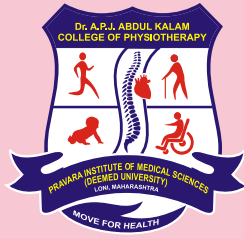

Introduction

Under the aegis of Pravara Medical Trust, a 100 bedded Pravara Rural Hospital was established in 1976 to provide comprehensive health care and medical service to the poor and needy of rural region of Ahmednagar district. In line with, Rural Medical College was established in 1984 to educate and train the doctors who would serve the rural poor. There was a need to prepare qualified nurses to provide comprehensive nursing care to patients admitted in Pravara Rural Hospital. Thus was born the Training College of Nursing in 1986. Then the school was up graded to College of Nursing in the year 1999 and BSc (Nursing) program was introduced. Additionally in 2008 and 2009 CON started the advanced courses such as PB.BSc, M.Sc and PhD program respectively, and CON has successfully completed 34 years of nursing education and training, and marching head...

College of Nursing is recognized by statutory bodies like Indian Nursing Council, New Delhi; Maharashtra Nursing Council, Mumbai; Maharashtra State Board for Nursing and Paramedical Education, Mumbai and Government of Maharashtra; and the institute is affiliated to Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences – Deemed to be University. We offer 10 courses in nursing sciences [GNM to PhD degree]. The intake capacity for GNM:100, B.Sc:100, PBBS:25, MSc:25 with 05 specialty and Certificate course: 10 seats. The college has all state of art facilities, amenities and qualified faculties (03 with PhD and 11 are pursuing PhD) as per INC norms.

The students of College of Nursing are fortunate to have clinical experience in 1275 bedded multi specialty tertiary care Pravara Rural Hospital located within the campus, and have a community health nursing facility, where it is affiliated with 11 PHC's; out of which 01 is Urban PHC's and 08 Rural PHC's and 02 are tribal PHC's.

In relation to research activity, faculty has completed 10 research projects, and has 17 ongoing researches; similarly PG students have completed 22 dissertations, and have 10 ongoing dissertations. Similarly UG students have completed 12 minor projects. There were 14 publications by faculty; all were in national/international peer reviewed indexed journals and had 15 scientific papers/poster presentations.

College of Nursing strongly believes that the basic component of nursing care is education and awareness creation. To fulfill the goal, faculty and students have carried out 18 community outreach activities at various schools and villages on health and illness aspects. Annual Report 2019-20

Introduction

The Centre for Social Medicine (CSM) established in 2001 by PMT to address the health inequalities and improve the social determinants of health of remote rural and tribal and urban slum people of the area, successfully completed its 14 years of service to the nation. The Centre was recognized as a Constituent Unit of Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences – Deemed to be University (PIMS-DU) on 31st May 2005 by UGC & Ministry of HRD, Government of India, to build a competent and skilled public health and allied health sciences manpower through teaching, research and extension, and consultancy.

While fulfilling its major agenda of Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR) of its parent organizations - PMT & PIMS-DU towards serving the marginalized sections of community in the area, the CSM has created the necessary infrastructure and enabling environment for implementing Community Oriented Medical Education (COME) and Community-Academic Partnerships (CAP), which is one of the unique features of all six Constituent Units of PIMS-DU.

Academics & Research

During the academic year 2019-20, the CSM continued to offer Masters in Public Health (MPH), Diploma in Optometry & Ophthalmic Assistant, Certificate programs in Social Health & Development (for international students), ICT in Rural Development. The CSM also organized short-term training programs in Arogya Mitra, Health Promoting School, Healthy Village and six Skill Development Training Courses (Anatomy &



Physiology, Nursing Aid, Geriatric Assistant, Dental Technician, Dental Hygienist) under Pramod Mahajan Skill & Entrepreneurship Development Program. Additionally the Vocational Training Centre got approval for 21 more skill development courses from MSSDS, Government of Maharashtra during 2019-20. All academic programs were successfully completed, as planned, in spite of unforeseen challenges encountered due to COVID 19 Pandemic.

The faculty and students of the Centre have actively engaged in 10 major and 6 minor action research projects and published 8 research articles in national and international indexed journals.

The Faculty were engaged in various action research and extension projects during the year funded to a tune of Rs. 10 million from external sources like MoHFW, National AIDS Control Organization, Govt. of India, Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MoTA) New Delhi, Tribal Research & Training Institute (TRTI), Pune, Maharashtra Nutrition Mission & UNICEF, Mumbai,



Maharashtra Women's Commission, Mumbai, Bajaj Auto CSR, Pune during 2019-2020.

Awards & Recognitions

Congratulations to all faculty members and students who have done extremely well in their curricular, extra-curricular and research activities. They brought laurels to the Institute by winning awards and recognitions of best paper presentations in Scientific Conferences/forums. - Dr. Amruta Mathew, MPH student won best paper award for her research paper in State IAPH Conference held in Dhule and the Nine Drake University Students who enrolled for Certificate in Social Health presented their research work in two groups in a Global Health Forum Meet in USA and won 1st Prize Awards.

During the Academic Year, the Centre for Tribal Health Research and Services – established by PIMS-DU Bhandardara Tribal Campus in 2018 under Centre for Social Medicine has been recognized as “Centre of Excellence in Tribal Healthcare and Research” and sanctioned a research project on documentation of traditional tribal healing practices and socio-economic profiles of tribal people in Maharashtra by Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India. The MoTA, Govt. of India has also recognized the “Comprehensive Tribal Healthcare Model” developed and implemented by the Centre as an Ideal Model for implementation at National level.

Major Scientific Events Organized

Besides, other scientific events, the two major ones organized by the Centre during the academic year include (1) National Conference on Tribal Health Research-Issues, Challenges and Opportunities on 19-21 September 2019 and (2) International Conference on Social Innovations in Global Public Health and Nursing Care on 7-8 January 2020.

The National Conference on Tribal Health Research which was co-sponsored by Ministry of

Tribal Affairs, Government of India, Tribal Research and Training Institute, Government of Maharashtra, Pune and WHO-India, participated by 333 delegates from 20 States across the country, including the Mr. Deepak Khandekar, Secretary, MoTA, Govt. of India, Mrs. Manisha Verma, Principal Secretary, Tribal Development Department, Government of Maharashtra, Dr. Abahy Bang, Director, SEARCH, Gadchiroli, Dr. H. Sudarshan, Secretary, VGKK, Bangalore. The final recommendations of the conference were printed and circulated under “Loni-Bhandardara Declaration” for improvement of the tribal health scenario at national level.

The International Conference on Social Innovations in Global Public Health was in collaboration with The College of New Jersey and Drake University, USA and attended by 270 delegates from India and abroad. The international speakers namely Dr Carole Kenner, Dr Pramod Mahajan, Prof Brenda Seals, Dr Sharon Byrne and Dr Patricia Messmer from College of New Jersey and Drake University and Dr. Chandrakant Lahariya, WHO-India have delivered key note addresses and plenary speeches.

Community Health, Empowerment and Development

The Centre has continued its commitment to address the health inequalities in rural and tribal areas through providing Primary Healthcare Services to nearly 5 lakh people of 300 adopted villages (100 tribal), through 8 Primary Health Centres, 2 Mobile Clinics and six Motorbike Ambulances-cum-health Clinics. As many as 1,47,899 patients were served in general OPD and Maternal & Child Health (MCH) Clinics of these Centres & Clinics.

As part of addressing the health inequalities of vulnerable sections of the community, the Centre continued to serve 1500 Female Sex Workers, 1500 LGBT people, 25,000 Migrant workers,



15000 Muslim women and children in Nashik, Malegaon, Bhivandi and Shirdi, Shirampur, Sangamner, Kopargaon, Rahata and Rahuri talukas of Maharashtra. Under this, the Centre has conducted 220 health check-up camps (93 camps, 4293 patients screened in Ahmednagar, 127 camps, 3151 patients in Malegaon) with free consultation, distribution of medicines, for general public, women and children, migratory sugarcane harvest workers, brick kiln & hotel workers, industrial workers & construction workers, female sex workers, homosexuals and transgender population. As many as 11956 patients were treated in these camps during August 2019 to July 2020.

The “Arogya Mitra” of sixteen Gram Arogya Banks has provided first aid and primary health care treatment to as many as 5000 patients during 2019-2020, besides providing various health education and promotional activities. CSM in collaboration with other constituent units of PIMS has organized 20 School Health Programs under SHAPE, 52 Namaskar Doctor-video conferencing program, 52 Hello Doctor Community Radio Program during the year.

g) Facilitate COME at PIMS University

The CSM facilitated Community Oriented Medical Education (COME) for 450 undergraduates, interns and postgraduate students of medicine, dentistry, nursing, physiotherapy through rural posting at Rural Health Centers, Mobile Medical Clinics, Health Check-up Camps, School Health Programs and other out-reach projects/program of CSM during 2019-2020

2. Research & Extension (Community & Social Health Interventional) Projects:

The CSM was engaged in implementation of social & public health interventional research projects funded by national and international organizations during 201-2020.

Ongoing Major External Funded Projects:

During the academic year 2019-2020, the centre was engaged in implementing 10 research & extension projects, of which 8 were external funded (1 by Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MoTA), New Delhi; 1 Tribal Research & Training Institute (TRTI), Pune, 3 by MSACS, Mumbai; 1 by CCD Trust (through UNICEF) Mumbai, 1 by CareNx, Mumbai, 1 by Bajaj Auto Mobile Ltd, Pune,).

Targeted Intervention for Migrant Worker- Ahmednagar:

PIMS is working with Migrant population especially migrated from UP, Bihar, Orissa, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal and working as Construction worker, Hotel worker, Bricks workers, Sugarcane workers, Hawkers in Rahata, Kopergon, Shrirampur, Sangamner and Rahuri Taluka of Ahmednagar District. Annual target of project is working with 10000 migrants from above area. Total registration was 41515 in five year's period. 16069 one to group sessions were conducted, out of which Peer Leaders conducted 13086 sessions and Outreach worker Conducted 3083 sessions covering population of 155181 migrant's. Out of which 41515 high risk migrants were registered with the project. 582 health camps were conducted in which 22298 migrants were screened and 1098 were detected with STI. Total 17737 migrants were screened for HIV and 26 migrants were detected to be HIV positive who were linked for ART. 227 mid media events were conducted where awareness was created among 6981 individual Migrants through street plays, poster exhibitions etc

Targeted Intervention HIV – Female Sex Workers, Nashik:

PMT is implementing targeted intervention for HIV with sex workers in Nashik district funded by Maharashtra State Aids Control Society (NACO).

The project is working with 1,500 hundred sex workers from Nashik, Manmad, Lasalgaon towns. Total sex workers registered since start of the project till July 20 are 2,550. Out of which 883 are brothel based sex workers, 1,347 home based, 189 lodges based and 189 street based sex workers. In the period of Aug 19 to July 20 project registered 104 new sex workers. Total clinic attendance for the said period of one year was 4241. Presumptive treatment was given to 334 sex workers, 54 were detected with STI and were treated. 2382 sex workers were screened for HIV, which includes repeat testing, out of which 1 was HIV positive, who were been linked to ART centre. 1,43,423 free Condoms were distributed and 77,830 socially marketed condoms, which shows increased awareness among sex workers for condom usage. Many individual and group awareness sessions were conducted. Many events were conducted and celebration of various festivals like World Women's Day, Ganpati, was done.

Woman's Day Program

A ramp walk event was organized by "PRAVARA MEDICAL TRUST" titled "STREE MHANUN HAWA SANMAN (Need Respect as Woman)" on 3rd March 2020 in Nasik to celebrate their womanhood and this was attended by people from all walks of life, such as Doctors, Lawyers, IT Professionals, Police, Media, Housewives, Students etc. Some of the prominent personalities from Nasik extended their support and acceptance by walking the ramp with these sex workers. Trans-genders were also part of this event and ramp walk.

A significant effort and a very bold step is taken by "PRAVARA MEDICAL TRUST" to enable these sex workers and trans-genders to be accepted by society for what they are without passing any judgment

Targeted Intervention HIV – Migrant Malegaon:

PMT is working with Migrant population especially migrated from UP, Bihar and working in Power Looms, Plastic & Construction in Malegaon. Project is working with 15,000 migrants in Malegaon city, Manmad & Umrana. Total registrations were 11,956 in a year's period. 5,328 one to group sessions were conducted, out of which Peer Leaders conducted 3,365 sessions and Outreach worker conducted 589 sessions

covering population of 37,741 migrant's. Out of which 11,956 high risk migrants were registered with the project. 127 health camps were conducted in which 3,151 migrants were screened and 127 were detected with STI. Total 2,595 migrants were screened for HIV and 3 migrants were detected to be HIV positive who were linked for ART. 85 mid media events were conducted where in awareness was created among 9,506 individual Migrants through street plays, poster exhibitions etc.

Urban Health & Nutrition Project Malegaon:

PMT started implementing Urban Health & Nutrition project in Malegaon since November 2017. The project is funded by UNICEF India and is supported by Committed Communities Development Trust Mumbai. Currently project is working in 3 high Risk (Golden Nagar, IMA & Nima 1) Urban Health Posts (UHP) out of 9 UHPs for Maternal, child and Adolescent health. A team of 32 community coordinators and three project supervisors are working in the project. An extension project was also implemented in Bhiwandi Nizamuddin Municipal Corporation with 27 community coordinators for 8 months. The project and field team was successfully handed over to both the municipal corporations in month of August 2020 to further implement the project. The activities conducted were social mapping and house to house survey to get baseline data. Eligible couples and children in the age of immunization were identified. Data triangulation of the same was done.

- (ii) Study of Case finding, diagnosis and treatment of moderate and severe acute malnutrition (SAM/MAM) and TB in Children (< 5 years) and reverse contact tracing for tuberculosis among their family members in tribal area of Ahmednagar district of Maharashtra.

3. Community Oriented Primary Health Care & Health Promotion Activities

The Centre provided primary health care and

referral services; during 2019-2020 to about 300,000 population residing 200 remote and tribal villages of Ahmednagar district through the following out-reach health centres, mobile clinics and other community health activities.

A) Rural Health Centres and Mobile Clinics:

As a part of 'Comprehensive community oriented decentralized primary health care delivery system', the Rural Health Centers (Babhaleshwar, Kolhar, Pathare, Zarekathi, Shendi, Rajur Lohare Mirpur & Fattyabad) and Mobile clinics (Loni & Bhandardara) located in remote rural & tribal areas of Ahmednagar district and covering 4 lakh population, catered Medical & Health services to (RHCs-1,15,227, & MCs - 16,264) General and MCH patients.

- e) Tribal health-Traditional Healing Practices and Ethno-medicine
- f) Tribal health-Innovative healthcare delivery models

The International Conference on Social Innovations in Global Public Health and Nursing Care was organized by Center for Social Medicine & College of Nursing of PIMS – DU on 07 - 09 January 2020 at Padmabhushan Balasaheb Vikhe Patil Lecture Hall Complex. The conference was inaugurated by Chief Guest Hon'ble Dr. Rajendra Vikhe Patil, Pro Chancellor, PIMS (DU) and Dr. Carole Kenner, Dean, School of Nursing, College of New Jersey, Dr. Pramod Mahajan, Professor, Drake University, USA & Dr. Y. M. Jayaraj, Vice - Chancellor, PIMS (DU) was guests of honor for the function. Prof. KV Somasundaram, Organizing Chairperson introduced the theme of conference and scientific programs, where Dr. Carole Kenner and Dr. Pramod Mahajan delivered the key note address in relation to conference themes followed by Lt. Col. (Retd) Dr. V. Radha Joint Organizing Chairperson delivered vote of thanks.

The two days conference had five scientific sessions including one virtual session on 'Universal Health Care' where 05 International Speakers namely Dr. Carole Kenner, Dr. Pramod Mahajan, Prof. Brenda Seals, Dr. Sharon Byrne

and Dr. Patricia Messmer, and 04 National Speakers namely Prof. K. V. Somsundaram, Dr. V. B. Bangal, Lt. Col. (Retd) Dr. V. Radha and Dr. Chandrakant Laharia had deliberations on various topics such as 1) Advancing Nursing and Health Care Globally 2) Social Innovations in Medical Education, Research, Healthcare delivery & Public Health by PIMS – DU 3) Mental Health First aid tool for improving Community support and decreasing stigma 4) Advances in prenatal diagnosis of genetic disorders 5) Innovations in Maternal Health for improving quality of care 6) Neonatal care – Latest trends including ventilation and therapeutic hypothermia and NICU design 7) Screening and improving quality of life for cancer patients 8) Innovations and advances in child health care 9) Improving cancer services among US tribal Native American groups 10) Advances in chemotherapy care & current concepts in palliative care and 11) Education methods for higher education in Nursing, and each session was moderated by two eminent chair persons.

A total of 270 delegates across 03 states of the country (Maharashtra, Gujarat and Karnataka) and 08 students from Drake University, USA

participated in the conference. During the conference a total of 36 research abstracts were presented in the form of posters and the same was evaluated by panel of judges. The conference was ended with valedictory function where Dr. Sunil Thitame, Chair, Scientific Committee presented the conference report and Dr. T. Sivabalan, Organizing Secretary offered the vote of thanks, and the conference had grand success.

On 9th Jan 2020 the International Delegates had a field visit in Tribal Area and got the firsthand experience of health care delivery in the tribal area of Ahmednagar at Rajur and Bhandardara.

Spreading awareness on COVID – 19 among Rural, Tribal & Urban-slum Communities

With the global impact of the pandemic, COVID-19 reigning chaos with unprecedented numbers and unmanageable ramifications, the Pravara Medical Trust (PMT) and Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences – Deemed to be University (PIMS-DU), stands steadfast and has adopted a multipronged and holistic approach to address concerns of all involved–COVID 19 Patients, Medical Fraternity, Distressed Migrant Families and awareness generation in rural and urban-slum community.

The Centre for Social Medicine in technical collaboration with Department of Community Medicine of Rural Medical College, Loni has initiated the following community awareness measures for prevention and control of COVID 19 in the operational area of PIMS -DU i.e., 300 rural and tribal villages and urban-slums of Ahmednagar and Nashik districts.

Designing and Producing relevant content

Sharing the right information with rural, tribal and urban-slum communities is emerging as an important need in tackling the COVID 19 pandemic. The unavailability of content in the local dialects and regional languages posed a big challenge.

With right earnest – 18th March 2020, before the national lockdown began, the Centre for Social Medicine designed health awareness and IEC material on COVID 19 which include handouts (10,000) conveying all relevant scientific, helpline information in a simple language, flex boards (Twenty one sets of Five Health Education Messages in local Marathi language with pictorial diagrams disseminating key information on (1) Dos and Don't's (2) Hand washing methods (3) Social



distancing, (4) Early signs and symptoms of COVID 19, (5) Self quarantine - stay at home-stay safe for prevention and control of COVID 19), and regular health talks through community radio etc.

Reaching the target audience through Leaflets/Handbills

Ten thousand copies of handouts printed in simple local Marathi providing key information on prevention and control of COVID 19 and distributed.

The target audience were reached with awareness generation through the CSM's extensive out-reach centres – Rural and Tribal Health Centre, Mobile Clinics, Motorbike ambulance and Gram Arogya Banks etc. The awareness leaflets are distributed along with the dry ration supplementary “food kit” in the tribal areas.

The handbills were distributed to the (1) patients and their relatives visiting the 10 Primary Health Centres, 2 Mobile Clinics, 6 motorbike-health clinics and 16 Gram Arogya Banks and through the (2) patients visiting Pravara Rural Hospital, Pravara Rural Dental Hospital, Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Centre etc and (3) through over 1000 Female Health Volunteers (FHV) working in 300 villages for general public in the operational area of Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences-Deemed to be University, Loni

Display of Flex Boards:

Twenty one sets of Five Health Education Messages in local Marathi language with pictorial diagrams disseminating key information on (a) Dos and Don'ts for prevention of COVID 19 (b) Precautions to be taken to prevent COVID 19, (c) Hand washing – Method, (d) Social distancing for prevention and control of COVID 19 were designed and printed on Flex Boards and displayed at the following locations:

Preparedness for COVID – 19 among Rural and Tribal Primary

Health Care Centres

With the COVID – 19 pandemic reigning chaos with unprecedented numbers and unmanageable ramifications, strong indication of community spread in India; the Pravara Medical Trust (PMT) and Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences – Deemed to be University (PIMS-DU), stands steadfast and has adopted a multipronged and holistic approach to address concerns at the Rural and Tribal Health Care Centers while addressing the following issues:

A. Health – Workers Safety.

B. Patient Care.

C. Health Information, outreach and communication.

D. Biomedical Waste Management and disinfection.

E. Monitoring and reporting.

The Centre for Social Medicine (CSM) is working following the SOP's issued by the PIMS – DU

from time – to – time with aforementioned activities with details as below at the Six (6) Rural Health Centres i.e. Babhaleshwar, Kolhar, Pathare, Zarekathi, Lohare & Fattyabad as well as two (2) Tribal Health Centers i.e. Bhandardara and Rajur.

A. Health Workers Safety:

- The guidelines from GOI (MoHFW) and GoM on modes on transmission, myths/misconceptions about COVID – 19, and PPE (handwashing and triple layers masks mainly) were circulated among all the healthcare workers working at these centers.
- Hand sanitizers and hand – washing points been provided at each point – of – use in the centers.
- Physical distancing norms are strictly implemented at all the centres during routine work.
- The centres have been divided into zones based with risk with restriction of outsiders and non –



medical in the high – risk areas.

- The health workers are conducting a self – assessment for symptoms daily as – well – as wellness and exposure checks.
- Ensure all staff working at the health centre are aware about the disease transmission and features of COVID-19, the rationale and importance of measures being put into place and complying with protocols no matter how tedious they may seem, and the importance of personal safety including when they return home.
- The first case in Ahmednagar District was found on 14th March, 2020. All the health staff were informed and advised to take appropriate precautions and follow the SOP’s. All the services by CSM were continued.
- 22nd March, 2020: “Janata Curfew”.
- The “National – Lockdown” was announced by His Excellency the Prime Minister of India Mr. N. D. Modi on 24th March, 2020 to be effective from 25th March, 2020 through 14th April, 2020 (Lockdown 1.0).
- The Director of CSM in consultation with all the staff on 25th March, 2020 decided that Mobile Clinic at Loni Bk and Bhandardara as well as Motor – Bike Health Clinic at Fattyabad, Zarekathi, Rajur and Bhandardara services be suspended due to limitation of space, safety of health workers and patients. These services will resume after the “Lockdown” opens.
- In this “Lockdown” the Motor – Bike Ambulance services at Fattyabad, Zarekathi, Rajur and Bhandardara as well as Medical Ambulance at Bhandardara Tribal Health Center and Rural Health Centre, Babhaleshwar are functioning while taking all the precautionary measures. Sixteen (16) emergency patients were referred to higher center by Motor – Bike Ambulance and 10 each patients were transported with Medical Ambulance at Bhandardara in April 2020.

- The surveillance activities for the ANC & BVC has been put on hold due to unavailability of public transport, safety of the women/children and nursing staff.
- General Health Check – Up Camps/Other Health related camps have been suspended as per the guidelines of GOI and GOM in the service catchment area.
- CSM request for separate vehicle to deliver medicines and indented supplies at all the center was approved by the Institute thus reducing the health workers risks and travel during Lockdown which was done majority by nursing staff.
- For routine work as cash deposits, bill payments (Telephone and Electricity) the staff was permitted to use their own vehicle to come to Loni and get the work done during “Lockdown”.

B. Patient Care:

- A designated health worker have been placed to screen patients at the gate/entry of the health centre to segregated patient flow based on symptoms at each facility entrance with appropriate signage.
- The designated health worker also elicits the history of travel to COVID – 19 affected areas or any household contacts visiting from those areas.
- Each patient entering the health facility are allowed to enter the health facility only after wearing a face mask/mouth & nose covered with cloth and after disinfecting the hands.
- Only a single patient is allowed at one time for examination.
- Proper social distancing norms are followed with in the campus of the heath facility.
- The COVID – 19 symptoms list along with the 24*7 Toll – Free Numbers (National, State, Local and Pravara Rural Hospital) are displayed on the Handouts and Flex displayed in and around the complex.
- A plan for referral of suspected cases / Severe Acute Respiratory Illness (SARI) to the designated Government healthcare facility and/or Pravara



Rural Hospital whichever is convenient for the patient and/or nearer.

- Tele – Consultation for minor ailments is provided to those in need as per the guidelines of MOHFW.
- 4933 patients received services at all the centres in the month of April 2020.
- With – in the first week of “Lockdown”, 14 patients from our centres with symptoms similar to COVID – 19 with history of travel from other areas were further referred to government hospital.

C.Health Information, outreach and communication

- Sharing the right information with rural and tribal patients visiting the centers is emerging as an important need in tackling the COVID 19 pandemic. The unavailability of content in the local dialects and regional languages posed a big challenge.
- With right earnest – 18th March 2020, before the national lockdown began, the Centre for Social Medicine designed health awareness and IEC material on COVID 19 which include handouts (10,000) conveying all relevant scientific, helpline information in a simple language, flex boards (Twenty one sets of Five Health Education Messages in local Marathi language with pictorial diagrams disseminating key information on (1) Dos and Don't's (2) Hand washing methods (3) Social distancing, (4) Early signs and symptoms of COVID 19, (5) Self quarantine - stay at home-stay safe for prevention and control of COVID 19), and regular health talks through community radio etc.

• Communication/Outreach: Reaching the target audience through Leaflets/ Handbills/ Display of Flex Boards:

- 800 copies of handouts printed in simple local Marathi providing key information on prevention and control of COVID 19 distributed

were distributed at all the centres and one rural health training center (Rahata) and Urban Health Training Center (Pravaranagar).

- The handbills were distributed to the (1) patients and their relatives visiting the 10 Primary Health Centres and the villages in the catchment area.
- Ten (10) sets of Six (6) Health Education Messages in local Marathi language with pictorial diagrams disseminating key information on (a) Dos and Don't's for prevention of COVID – 19 (b) Precautions to be taken to prevent COVID – 19, (c) Hand washing – Method, (d) Social distancing for prevention and control of COVID – 19 were designed and printed on Flex Boards and displayed at the strategic locations at 10 Health Centers.
- Health workers (Medical Officers, Nurses, Field Workers of Rajur and Bhandardara Tribal Health Centers and Motorbike Health Clinic staff were actively involved in distribution of “Food Kit” (Dry Ration) in selective and needy tribal families of Akole Taluka.

D.Biomedical Waste Management and Disinfection:

- All the health workers are trained in segregation of Biomedical Waste Management using the color coded containers which is stringently followed at all the health centre. The BMW generated is disposed followed by the guidelines as given by the government.
- Site of collection of biomedical waste is regularly disinfected with freshly prepared 1% hypochlorite solution.
- 1% Sodium hypochlorite solution is used to disinfect all the frequently touched surfaces such as tables, rails, the arms of chairs, sinks, call bells, door handles and push plates, and any area/piece of equipment that may potentially be contaminated while 70% ethanol is used for phones, computers, keyboards, and other electronics) which happens three times daily at all the centers.



- Ventilation is well maintained at all the centers while disinfecting and also at other times.

E. Monitoring and Reporting: NOTES

- A Whatapp Group that includes all the Medical – Officers of Rural and Tribal health centers have been created with Director of CSM as the group administrator in lieu of:
 - a. Updating the staff of upcoming guidelines.
 - b. Monitoring as well as reporting of suspected cases of COVID – 19 on regular basis.
 - c. Addressing/Discussing the difficulties faced by the staff in view of the COVID – 19 pandemic.
 - d. Addressing the grievances if any from the staff or the patients.

- COVID – 19 Survey: All the family who are residing on the PMT campus i.e. three hundred and four (304) were surveyed on daily basic by 3 ANM’s from Centre for Social Medicine for 14 consecutive days from 5th April, 2020 through 18th April, 2020. The survey was related to COVID – 19 related symptoms as a) Fever b) Dry Cough c) Common Cold d) Difficulty in breathing along with history of travel to COVID – 19 affected areas or a visitor from these areas. The report was submitted to Government Primary Health Center (PHC), Dadh on 22nd April, 2020.

There has be a decrease in patient attending the RHC which is substantially higher in April 2020 in comparison to March 2020 within the same time frame i.e. April 2019 and March 2019 with a decrease of 52.83% and 16.14% respectively. Probable reasons been:

- a. Lockdown
- b. Lack of Public transport
- c. Surveillance activities for the ANC & BVC has been put on hold for safety of the women, children, and nursing staff.

Future Plans:

A.Training: The training for “Female Health Volunteers” working with CSM will be conducted at Rural Health Centres.

B.Awareness Activity to Continue till the Normalcy

These awareness activities will be further intensified and carried after the lockdown also with full capacity till the state of normalcy has returned in the society.





Food kit Distribution

The COVID-19 pandemic has challenged lives of many people in India and around the world. The National “Lockdown” to control the disease has put a great deal of trouble on the poor and marginal workers, contractual labour, women and children. The worst affected are the poor tribal, who lost their temporary jobs in cities and towns and returned to their native villages on foot, as there were no public transport facilities.

Bhandardara area in Akole Block of Ahmednagar district, Maharashtra is covered by dense forest with remotely located villages on the Western Ghats, at the foot of the Kalsubai peak in Sahyadri mountain range on the border of three districts of Ahmednagar, Thane and Nashik. The tribal communities - Mahadev Koli, and Thakar inhabited in this area migrate for six months a year for employment mainly in the agricultural fields of Junnar, Narayangaon, Alephata and Pune (Rural) district. The Centre for Social Medicine of PIMS-DU of Pravara Medical Trust, Loni has adopted 100 remotest tribal villages in this area since 2006 for providing quality medical, primary health care, preventive healthcare at their doorsteps through innovative means – Tribal Health Centres, Mobile Clinics, Motorbike Ambulance-Health Clinics, Gram Arogya Banks, Arogya Mitras and other livelihood & skill development activities engaging local gram panchyats and CBOs.

As Dr. Rajendra Vikhe Patil, President, PMT & Pro-chancellor, PIMS-DU couldn't be a silent spectator to the tragedy embarked on these poor tribal families due to COVID 19 NATIONAL LOCKDOWN, took the lead with an initial donation of Rs. 5 lakhs. The trust has also received some donations from likeminded individuals. He instructed the Centre for Social Medicine to design a supplementary food kit program for at least 2000 tribal families. Accordingly, CSM initiated distribution of “Food Kit” -10 Kgs Rice,

2 Kgs of Dal (1 Kg Moong Dal, 1 Kg Tur Dal), 1 Kg each of Sugar, Wheat, Salt, Spices and 1 Liter of Cooking Oil, in the operational area of 100 villages to meet 15 days of their food requirement in the first week of April, under the guidance of Dr. Y.M. Jayaraj, Vice Chancellor, of PIMS-DU. Accordingly, the CSM team engaged in the tribal area has identified the most vulnerable families, so that we could reach them with Food Kit.

As many as 220 health check-up camps (93 camp, 4293 patients screening in these camps in Ahmednagar, 127 camp organized by TI, Malegaon and as many as 3151 patients screening in these camps) with free consultation, distribution of medicines, were organized during 2018-19 for general public, women and children, migratory sugarcane harvest workers, brick kiln & hotel workers, industrial workers & construction workers, female sex workers, homosexuals and transgender population. As many as 7444 patients treated in these camps during August 2019 to July 2020

Hb % & Blood group Check-up : Hb% & Blood group check-up camps were organized by RHCs Zarekathi, Kolhar, Pathare, Lohare, Babhleshwar, Fattyabad, Rajur and Shendi, as many as 5000 students diagnosis in these check-up camps.

4. Networking with National & International Organizations:

The Centre continued to be empanelled as Technical Consultant/Collaborative Partner for Public Health Training, Research & Service Delivery with SHSRC, Pune, MSACS, Mumbai; NMP+ Pune, Nashik Municipalities Corporation; Baja Auto Ltd., Pune, RMNHC+A, UNICEF, Mumbai, Oregon State University, IE3 Global Internship Program, USA and various other international universities in collaboration with PIMS-DU.

5. Community Empowerment: Advocacy & BCC

a. Health talk through Community Radio: The Centre has coordinated "Hello Doctor" Program wherein 20 faculty members from medical, dental, nursing and physiotherapy colleges have delivered health talks through 90.8 Mz Pravara Community Radio on every Wednesday.

b. Health talk through e-health & Video Conferencing:

The Centre has coordinated "Namaskar Doctor – video conferencing" program on every Tuesday in collaboration with all Constituent Units and IT Department of PIMS-DU through village e-health centres to reach thousands of people in the remotest villages with health education and awareness.

c. School Health, Hygiene and Environmental Program (SHAPE):

During the year, SHAPE was implemented in 5 Schools (2 Government (Z.P) & 3 Private - one exclusively for Deaf & Dumb) addressing over 1,150 students and 49 teachers & staff members. These schools are spread in remote & tribal villages of Ahmednagar district, Maharashtra. Besides, health, hygiene & nutrition talks and practical demonstrations involving students on scientific way of "hand washing with soap", brushing the teeth, nail cutting, physical exercises, environmental cleanliness, the SHAPE includes various other social, physical health promotional activities designed and implemented along with the empowered "School Health Committees" to make the schools as "Health Promoting Schools", in the long run. The program was implemented in joint collaboration with the respective departments' faculty and students of Rural Dental College, College of Physiotherapy, College of Nursing of PIMS-DU, Loni.

Center is provides technical support i.e. Monitoring, Training of Arogya Mitrs ,Training of village health committee members These Arogya Banks, which are equipped with

adequate furniture, First Aid Boxes, Primary Drugs & supplies, digital BP apparatus, Glucometers, weighing machines, height measuring tapes, preliminary dental & physiotherapy equipments, health library etc - provides comprehensive universal primary health care to nearly 32,250 people residing in 16 villages of 5 Blocks (Rahata, Sangamner, Shrirampur, Rahuri, Akole (Tribal) of Ahmednagar district.

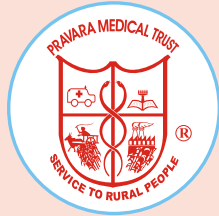

Introduction :

Pravara Rural Hospital & Medical Research Centre is 1275 bedded Multidiscipline's, Superspecialty Hospital with state-of-art gadgets, equipments including 64 Rows 128 Slice CT Scan, 1.5 Tesla MRI, Linear Accelerator with IMRT & well equipped ICUs and ICCU. Modern Hi-tech Central Clinical Laboratory (CCL), Blood Bank with component separation facilities. Cancer Treatment & Research Centre supports the hospital. Ancillary units such as Physiotherapy & Rehabilitation and Holistic Medicine departments for patient care are available in hospital.

- o Hospital serves approximately 50,00,000 populations, covering 500 rural, remote tribal, hilly villages and urban slums. Over 186 free Paediatrics Heart Surgeries have been performed till date. Over a Lakh patients have been registered so far at Rural Cancer Treatment & Research Centre which has established its own Rural Cancer Registry (Centre Code No. 513) and Day Care setup. Currently we have an advance treatment facility of Linac with IMRT and high dose rate Brachytherapy system.
- o The Pravara Rural Hospital continues rendering quality services with visible accomplishments.
- o Pravara Rural Hospital had over 7,25,380 OPDs attendance of which over 3,80,519 were new patients and 3,44,861 were old patients with an average daily attendance of 2,450.61 patients.
- o IPD attendance was 2,79,632 patients with average daily bed occupancy of 764.02 %.
- o During the period hospital have organized 01 Multi-diagnostic (multi-specialty) camp in which a total of 1355 patients were examined and as many as 33 Mini Medical camps including Dental camps in which 6,135 patients were examined. Patients requiring further specialized services were brought to main hospital for evaluation and treatment. 73 Voluntary Blood Donation Camps have organized during the period in which 2749 Blood Units were collected.
- o During the period between August'2019 to July'2020, total of 52,464 operations were performed, which includes 10,093 major surgeries, 6529 minor surgeries and 35,842 minor procedures performed in various specialists OPDs.
- o The hospital assists State and Central Government to implement their National Public Health Programmes.
- o The institute provides sophisticated diagnostic and therapeutic facilities like





Ultrasonography, Color Doppler, CT Scan, MRI, DSA, Mammography, Digital X-Ray with PACS, Cardiac Monitors, etc.

- o Spacious specialty out-patient & diagnostic departments and In-patient wards are available with residential expert medical and paramedical teams.
- o Central Clinical Laboratory (CCL) consists of Pathology (Morbid Anatomy, Cytology, Haematology), Biochemistry and Microbiology is well equipped and caters to the needs of patients. The hospital CCL also functions as a referral centre for nearby pathologists and laboratories.
- o The Blood Bank of the Hospital is equipped with state-of-art equipments to perform routine and special investigations including HIV Test (Elisa reader) and separation of blood to prepare blood components. The blood component therapy has proved to be a boon for the needy patients.
- o Dialysis Unit caters to the needs of high incidence of insecticide poisoning and snake-bites leading to kidney failure, which is very common among agricultural workers.
- o Emergency and Trauma care is provided round the clock by experts. These services are augmented with the latest diagnostic facilities like invasive and non-invasive imaging techniques, on the spot transfusion and other resuscitative techniques.
- o Major as well as specialized surgeries including Paediatric Cardiothoracic, Neurology, Urology, Laproscopic, Spinal, Micro Laryngeal, Oral & Maxillo Facial Surgery, Reconstructive and replacement surgeries are performed in a centrally air conditioned Operation Theatre Complex housing eight OTs which are equipped with excellent operating and monitoring facilities.
- o Besides this, every Out-patient department has it's own operation theatre for day care services.
- o Advanced Neonatal Unit, Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and Paediatric Intensive Care Unit take care of preterm babies, critically ill neonates, infants and children ensuring an excellent salvage rate.
- o Intensive Care Unit is well equipped with state-of-art monitoring and life support systems for the care of the critically ill.
- o ICCU a six bedded ICCU equipped with latest of the Ventilators, Multipara Monitors, External Cardiac Pace Maker and 24 hours continuous Holter ECG monitoring facilities, caters for the needs of critically ill cardiac patients.
- o ICUs: A well equipped 14 bedded Medical ICU, 11 bedded Surgical ICU and 04 bedded Respiratory ICU caters for critically ill patients



from these disciplines. Medical ICU also caters for facility of bedside Haemodialysis.

- o Sai Abherna Cardiac Care Cath. Lab. Centre was established and inaugurated by Hon'ble Smt. Sindhutai Vikhe Patil on 02nd Apr'2019 in presence of Dr. Rajendra E Vikhe Patil, CEO, PMT & Pro-Chancellor, PIMS-DU, Mrs. Monika Swapnil Sawant Inamdar, Trustee, PMT, Hon'ble Y M Jayraj, Vice-Chancellor, PIMS-DU & Dr. Sunil Agrawal, Director, Sai Abherna Cardiac Cath. Lab. Centre and started functioning. Angiography and angiography procedures are routinely being done.
- o New MRI Machine:- A new MRI "Philips Trodia 1.5 Tesla" & X-Ray Machine 300 MA with High frequency with Generator, Make Siemens were installed and started functioning in the Dept. of Radiology.

Specialised Dental Care:

The routine dental department rendered by the Pravara Rural Hospital, Loni since 1976 has been expanded, in response to the demand, to a full-fledged Dental Hospital with all specialties in 1989.

Specialized diagnostic procedures include Orthopentogram and Cephalogram. Specialized treatment procedures like Maxillofacial and Orthognathic surgery, advanced Conservative treatment, aesthetic dentistry, ceramics, cast dentures and maxillofacial prosthesis are the additional features of this hospital.

Pravara Rural Dental Hospital also has full-fledged extension OPDs in the nearby urban areas like Sangamner, Rahata to serve the urban poor. The hospital also conducts regular "Out Reach" programme like medical camps, school student's dental check up etc.



Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Care:

Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation care is being rendered by the hospital since 1980 over a period of time Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Centre has been expanded to have state-of-art Diagnostic facilities. It is attached to the College of Physiotherapy since 1997. The Centre has with specialized therapeutic procedures full fledged orthotic and prosthetic laboratories and other modern and advanced equipments, caters to the needs of out-patients and in-patients of Pravara Rural Hospital.

The Orthotic and Prosthetic workshop has facilities to design and prepare all types of static and dynamic splints, calipers, crutches, collars, braces, prostheses, corrective modified shoes, wheel chairs, tricycles and other locomotive devices for physically challenged.

Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) Rehabilitation Centre is fully functional with indoor and playground facilities under the aegis of "SPINALIS" OF Sweden and Karolinska Institute.



Major Infrastructure:

o Govt. Schemes:

Hospital is empanelled for various Government Health Schemes.

- Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojana (MJPJAY), which is boon for rural poor for treatment for various diseases including cancer.
- Ex Serviceman Contributory Health Services (ECHS): Ex Serviceman Army Personnel and their dependents.
- Janani Suraksha Yojana for women who deliverers in hospital.
- Hospital Cashless Insurance Schemes (MD India Insurance Com., United India Insurance Com., Oriental India Insurance Com., The New India Insurance Com., National Insurance Com.) are also available.

o Major Infrastructures:

- o Establishment of new COVID-19 Isolation Dedicated Care Hospital (DCH): Due to pandemic of COVID-19, hundred (100) bedded "A&B" wing as general ward & "C" wing as ICU was established on 02nd May'2020 and started functioning with approval of the District Disaster Managment Authorities & Taluka Incident Commander, Rahata dated 07.07.2020.
- o Separate stand alone Liquid Oxygen Plant Facility has been created for uninterrupted high flow O2 to COVID patients.
- o Establishment of new Molecular Lab. In the Microbiology Dept.: After approval of the NABL Authority dated 05.05.2020, above 6000 Tests of TrueNat RT-PCR & Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) were carried out.
- o Establishment of new Swab Collection



Centre: A Throat & Nasopharyngeal Swab Collection Centre has been established near Civil Dept. for detecting COVID-19 patients / subject. This facility caters to the need of screening out COVID positive cases by doing Rapid Antigen Tests at a minimal cost and is available on request. So far more than 4000 individual have been tested on RAT test alone.

- o Referral Patients from Civil Hospital: Because of the pandemic the District Civil Government Hospital, Ahmednagar requested PRH/PMT to take on the non-COVID patients for further management, since their own facilities were converted to treat only COVID patients. PMT has thus simultaneously taken on the responsibility of treating both COVID & Non-COVID patients.
- o Shifting & Renovation of Blood Bank: As per FDA Authorities Blood Bank located at ground floor has been shifted to 1st floor of OPD Complex. Enlarging of facilities with Plasma Phoresis to make Single Donor Platelets (SDP) and other Blood Components.

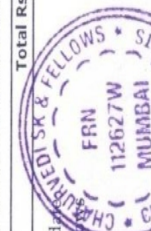

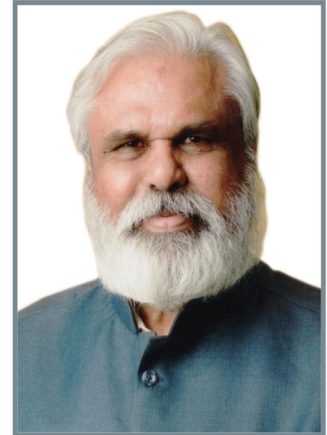
