The Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed to be University) involved in NIRF Ranking Frame from the year 2017-18. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (DU) volunteered itself for NIRF 2018 under overall & University category for the first time. The Institutional ranking as per NIRF was declared & announced on 3/4/2018 Rank List
- Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed to be University) has been placed in the "Rank Band of 101-150" among all the Universities in India (among more than 1200) and was placed in the "Rank Band of 150-200" among the overall category of Institutions of India (Around 4500)

- Institutions, of which 1200+ were Universities including IIT, NIL, AIIMS & Central/State Universities).
- The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of PIMS University since its inception has been working on developing quality and key performance indicators for the institution and its constituent Colleges/Institutions. - METHOD AND DENTAL IMPLANT FOR GRAFTING PLATELET RICH FIBRIN (I-PRF)
 AROUND THE DENTAL IMPLANT: Dr. DEEPAK VIKHE
- The present disclosure relates to a field of dental implantology, and more precisely it concerns a
 dental implant and implantation method for grafting injectable platelet rich fibrin (I-PRF) around said
 implant.
- Dental Implants have revolutionized the treatment modality for replacing missing teeth with implant prostheses. Ability of implants to osseointegrate with the alveolar bone of the patient leads to its success. The problem in some cases is, there is inadequate bone available for implant. In such cases Primary Stability of implant will be affected by this deficient Bone. Bacterial biofilms can form on it soon after implantation, causing infections. One approach to this problem has been development of bioactive surgical additives. The main challenge in clinical research is development and application of bioactive surgical additives to control inflammation and increase the speed of healing process. In this sense, platelet rich fibrin (PRF) appears as a natural and satisfactory alternative. There are various technique of using PRF. This techniques need skill and practice to use PRF.
- This method aims to explain new Implant design that disperses an I-PRF solution from the inside out. The screw section of new implant is made of a reservoir running vertically down the inside. That reservoir is filled with (INJECTABLE) PRF, and then cover screw is placed. The solution will begin to slowly diffuse out, through the vents in implant, keeping biofilms from forming or avoiding at the screw/bone interface and accelerate healing process.
